4/09-10/09	Aurora	Main Street in Aurora undergoing huge reconstruction. Street in front of library has been closed to traffic, water shut off and programs have been canceled due to street issues. This is expected to continue until October 2009.

	System-Wide	A determination was made that all PCs in the public venue will be counted as Internet-able PCs. All PC counts were updated in February 2009.
	* City Branches & Central	A formula error impacting February 2007 and February 2008 year to date totals was found in February 2009. This error understated results for both years (actual activity was higher than previously reported). Incorrect year to date figures for Buffalo Branches and the Central Library were subsequently carried into 2008 calculations and comparison data. Spreadsheets have been retrospectively corrected as of April 2009.
