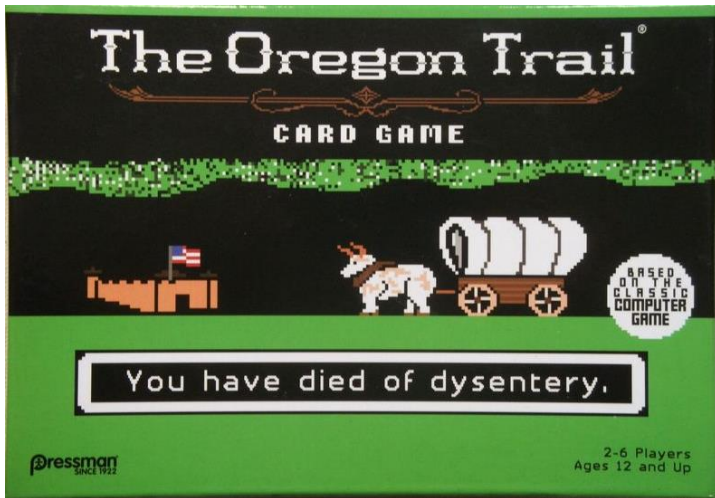

Players work together to move along the trail, fording rivers and playing Supply Cards to overcome calamities. And every time players go the way of all flesh, you'll flip over the roster card and write their names on tombstones (don't forget to include a quick epitaph).
