**Buffalo & Erie County Public Library (B&ECPL) System Board of Trustees**  
15 Members, appointed by the Erie County Executive and the Erie County Legislature



The Buffalo & Erie County Public Library System Board of Trustees consists of 15 members who serve five-year terms on a rotating schedule. The trustees are appointed by the Erie County Executive, who appoints ten members (two each calendar year), and the Mayor of Buffalo, who appoints five members (one each calendar year). All recommended trustees are subject to confirmation by the Erie County Legislature.

**B&ECPL System Director**  
Appointed by B&ECPL Board



The Director serves as the administrative, executive and fiscal officer of the B&ECPL System under the supervision and jurisdiction of the Board of Trustees. The Director also oversees business affairs, administration and employees of the Central Library and the eight Buffalo branches.

**Contracting Libraries**  
Contract for Services from Library System



Each of the 22 contracting libraries has its own Board of Trustees. Libraries annually contract with the System for services, including circulation, technology, programming, materials, etc. The System provides funding for almost all of the operations of member libraries, while the local municipality or membership association provides for the library building and capital needs.

Acts as a Liaison

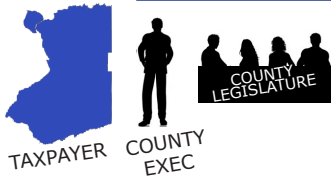

## Taxpayers/Erie County Property Owners Library Property Tax \$26,435,688 in 2022

A local law, the *Library Protection Act*, dedicates a portion of Erie County's real property tax for library purposes and guarantees that funds appropriated by the Legislature cannot be reappropriated to cover mid-year shortfalls elsewhere in the County budget.

System Board has four main committees:

Executive Committee

Acts on behalf of the Board if necessary, between Board meetings; has all the powers and duties of the Board of Trustees.

Budget and Finance Committee

Has general management of the finances, funds and investments of the corporation. With the Director, prepares a budget request as required by Erie County.

Policy Committee

Supports the development of policies for HR, circulation of materials, collection development, access to Library facilities and resources for effective operations.

Building Oversight Committee

Ensures that adequate facilities are designed, situated, constructed and maintained to meet B&ECP's mission of service to the community.

## New York State Aid

Formula aid is provided by the Governor & State Legislature for public library systems. State aid supports programs & services such as Interlibrary Loan delivery, continuing education, coordination of collection development, automation & internet access. Direct formula aid to assist individual public libraries is provided by the Local Service Aid program through library systems. Libraries that meet minimum standards set by the Education Department can receive this aid. \$2,194,286 in 2022.
