ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR





A Message from Library System Director John Spears

Dear friend and supporter of Buffalo & Erie County Public Libraries,

Having moved to Buffalo just last year, I am continually inspired by the strength of our community. Together, this past year, we faced some unimaginable tragedies that had an impact on the entire region – from the May 14 targeted supermarket shooting to record-breaking blizzards. While these events will define 2022, how this city and region responded is an incredible indicator of the true nature of Erie County, a resilient, caring community that assists neighbors in need and shows love in the face of hate.

I hope you recognize, as I surely have, how your libraries take action to support the needs of our great community. An example of this was seen immediately following the racial killing of ten of our fellow residents. Less than 24 hours later, Buffalo's Frank E. Merriweather, Jr. Branch Library, located just a block away, provided a safe space for conversation, emotional support, privacy, and the community to come together. Merriweather Manager Joshua Mitch and his team worked tirelessly to provide patrons with much needed support. Joshua's efforts were recognized by the New York Library Association when they named him *Public Librarian of the Year* last year for his leadership and efforts to keep his team focused on staying strong, caring for one another, and helping to lift community spirit.

Your libraries serve their communities in many ways, though, from workforce development to offering places for community collaboration, creativity, and the free exchange of ideas in an atmosphere that will always protect intellectual freedom. We are dedicated to standing firm against the censorship challenges being faced by communities all over the world, and we are engaging

in a campaign to educate the public on the realities of censorship and how they can take action in support of keeping libraries free of book restrictions.

Your Buffalo & Erie County Public Libraries went *fine free* in 2022. Why? Because overdue fines create a barrier to library access, and this inequity is counter to our ideals. Traditionally, when patrons are unable to pay fines, they are less likely



to visit the library. In many cases, this has a direct impact on children. Our *fine free* initiative has given more readers the ability to experience and enjoy everything our 37 libraries and two mobile units have to offer.

It is an honor to serve Erie County residents and you have my heartfelt appreciation for your continued support of libraries.
