## Erie County to Commemorate March as Women's History Month

Kickoff Scheduled for March 5 at the Downtown Library

A coalition of partners including the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, Erie County Commission on the Status of Women, WNY Women's Foundation, WomenEventsBuffalo, Women's Business Center at Canisius College, Junior League of Buffalo, Planned Parenthood of Central and Western NY, League of Women Voters, University at Buffalo Gender Institute, Women on the Rise, and AAUW-Buffalo Chapter will unveil local plans for commemorating Women's History Month in Buffalo and Erie County on **Thursday, March 5** at the Downtown Central Library, 1 Lafayette Square.

From 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., more than two dozen non-profit organizations providing activities and services for women will offer displays and free resource materials. At 12 noon, the Kickoff Ceremony will feature performances by Buffalo Seminary's SEMACHORDS vocal group and Teen Reality Theatre of Planned Parenthood of Central and Western NY; remarks by local dignitaries; and the unveiling of the new 2015 Women's History Month calendar, replete with programs and networking opportunities occurring across Erie County throughout March. The calendar will be available at all Erie County public buildings and all 37 public libraries; also on the websites <a href="https://www.BuffaloLib.org">www.BuffaloLib.org</a> and <a href="https://www.BuffaloLib.org">www.BuffaloLib

Featured at the Kickoff Ceremony will be presentations of the second annual "Woman of Character, Courage & Commitment" Awards and keynote speaker **Noemi "Ami" Ghazala**, superintendent of the National Park Service's Women's Rights National Historical Park in Seneca Falls, NY. Ghazala is a graduate of St. John's University and has served in education positions at several National Park Service sites including the Statue of Liberty National Monument/Ellis Island Immigration Museum in New York City and the Jean Lafitte National Historical Park and Preserve in New Orleans. She is also a children' book author and has been an overseas freelance photojournalist focused on women's issues, and a teacher.

The Women's Rights National Historical Park tells the story of the first Women's Rights Convention held in Seneca Falls in 1848, and the struggles that continue for civil rights, human rights, and gender equality across the globe.
