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READ ALOUD 15 CAMPAIGN KICKOFF



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Read Aloud 15 Campaign Kickoff

Today the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library System along with local officials and students from the Jewish Community Center and Bennett Park Montessori School kicked off "Read Aloud 15",a new campaign which encourages adults to read aloud to a child for 15 minutes every day.

Joining Library System Director Mary Jean Jakubowski and County Executive Mark C. Read Aloud is a national initiative which began in 2008 with a goal to make reading aloud every day for at least 15 minutes the new standard in child care. When every child is read to for 15 minutes every day from birth, more children will be ready to learn when they enter kindergarten, more children will have the literacy skills needed to succeed in school, and more children will be prepared for a productive and meaningful life after school.

According to a 2003 Hart and Risley report, some American children will hear 30 million fewer words than their peers before the age of four. Studies have shown the number of words a child knows when entering kindergarten is predictive of future learning success.

Library Director Jakubowski said, "This is easy advice for parents to follow. All you need is a book - free, with a free library card. There is no better way to spend quality time with your child. The benefits are great - your child is likely to learn to read sooner, think better, imagine more richly, discover more quickly and become a passionate and lifelong reader."

Following today's announcement, the local leaders each read a children's book to the Pre-K students and juggler / entertainer Nels Ross of In Jest performed.
