Celebrating 180 years of book borrowing, the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library System has approximately 300,000 library cardholders. Libraries have free WiFi, computer training, multi-language databases, career and business resources, job clubs, early literacy tools for school readiness, family programs, author lectures, health fairs and much, much more.
