## to be Celebrated at Downtown Central Library

## Saturday, August 19 & Monday, August 21

The Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, 1 Lafayette Square in downtown Buffalo, will host a free, all-ages Family Day called "Eclipse-O-Rama!" on Saturday, August 19 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. A broad array of hands-on activities, games and technology demonstrations themed to the unusual solar eclipse occurring on August 21, the planets and space exploration will be offered by the Library and its Buffalo Eclipse Consortium partners, which include:

## 6/20/2019 THE 2017 GREAT AMERICAN ECLIPSE TO BE CELEBRATED AT DOWNTOWN CENTRAL LIBRARY Saturday, August 19 & Monday, ...

"Eclipse-O-Rama!" is free and open to the public. This event is a project of the Library's inclusion in the NASA @ My Library Program, one of 75 libraries selected from across the nation. Presented by NASA, StarNet and American Library Association, NASA @ My Library brings NASA astronomy resources to libraries to encourage curiosity and STEM learning.

In addition, the Downtown Central Library will be a viewing site for the solar eclipse on **Monday, August 21 from 1:00-3:30 p.m.** Buffalo is not in the eclipse's "path of totality," but given clear conditions, an anticipated 60% eclipse may be seen. The public is invited to the Library on this special astronomical occasion for a group viewing at the Washington Street main entrance.

The public is reminded that proper viewing equipment should be used to safely view the eclipse to avoid eye damage. Nearly 3,000 eclipse glasses were distributed through the 37 Buffalo & Erie County Public Libraries earlier this month. A limited number of free glasses will be available on Saturday, August 19 and Monday, August 21 at Central Library during the program. The Library expresses its sincere appreciation to Buffalo State College – President's Office and Whitworth Ferguson Planetarium for making the eclipse glasses available to the Libraries.
