



Books for Kids Campaign Kickoff Over 2.8 Million Books Distributed

The annual **BOOKS FOR KIDS** campaign held its official kickoff yesterday at The Salvation Army, which is a beneficiary of the program. The ceremony highlighted the fact that more than 2.8 million new books have been distributed to children in need since the **BOOKS FOR KIDS** initiative started back in 1995 as a partnership between The Buffalo News, Project Flight and Buffalo State College. It has now successfully grown to include support from the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library System, WGRZ-Channel 2, Wegmans and Townsquare Media radio stations WBLK and WYRK.

This year the community donation drive runs April 1 - 30, 2018.

"For an amazing quarter of a century, **BOOKS FOR KIDS** has ensured every child has a book of his or her own. A love of reading is one of the keys to a great future. The Buffalo News is thrilled to help make that happen," said Mike Connelly, editor of The Buffalo News.

"We know that literacy helps to promote problem solving and thinking skills, critical for a child's success in school and life. **BOOKS FOR KIDS** has helped put a book in the hands of millions of children in need, and Wegmans is proud to help support this program that makes it easy for our shoppers to give," said Michele Mehaffy, Buffalo consumer affairs manager for Wegmans Food Markets.

"Wonderful things happen when children are given a book of their own. Reading a book or being read to truly engages the mind and inspires creativity, discovery and resourcefulness," said Library Director Mary Jean Jakubowski.

A community book drive takes place on Friday, April 20 at Wegmans, 5275 Sheridan Dr., Williamsville, beginning at 5:00 a.m. with live broadcast remotes on WGRZ-Channel 2's Daybreak program and WYRK Radio's morning drive. From 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. the *Library on Wheels* Bookmobile will be stationed in the Wegmans parking lot and open for browsing and borrowing. A Storytelling program for children is scheduled inside the store at 10:30 a.m. One can bring a new book to donate to the drive or purchases can be made at Wegmans.
