newest outdoor Space on Sunday, October 28

launch of Buffalo's new reading park!

The public is invited to "*Fall in Love with Buffalo's Reading Park*" on Sunday, October 28 from 12:30 to 5:00 p.m. at the downtown Central Library, 1 Lafayette Square. This free afternoon of fall festivities, which includes family-friendly musical performances, hands-on craft activities, story times, a pumpkin patch, petting zoo, cider and donuts, poetry, and more, will launch downtown Buffalo's newest public space on the Central Library's front lawn, adjacent to Lafayette Square and anchoring Buffalo's Literary Corridor on Washington Street.

Ceremonies launching the Reading Park will take place at 2:00 p.m. Children are encouraged to attend in costume to participate in a festive Kazoo Parade in the Park at 3:00 p.m. The afternoon performance schedule includes family entertainers Kevin McCarthy and The Hill Brothers, hip hop performers Differential Flava Crew, Latin beat with Son Borikua, Taylor Made Jazz, Just Buffalo Literary Center's spoken word poets, hula hoop master Benjamin Berry and a chess workshop.

Buffalo's Reading Park was made possible through the national Southwest Airlines® Heart of the Community program, with planning/design support from Project for Public Spaces. The Library's main entrance ramp and adjacent greenspace were targeted to be improved and with performance spaces, seating, public art, and new landscaping, plus regular all-ages outdoor programming to highlight literacy, the arts, and the heritage and diversity of the city. Design and programming ideas were suggested through a series of public meetings and surveys, and through design development student work at the University at Buffalo School of Architecture & Planning. Reading Park construction is projected to be completed by early summer 2019.

"We are so excited to launch this new space in the center of downtown with our many generous partners, particularly our friends at Southwest Airlines," stated Library Director Mary Jean Jakubowski. "This project will undoubtedly make a visible, lively difference in downtown Buffalo and for the Central Library. We can't wait to have everything fully completed and available to everyone in our community for fun, learning and exploring."

The Reading Park is a collaborative venture by the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library with partners: the City of Buffalo, Buffalo Place Inc., Just Buffalo Literary Center, WNY Book Arts Center, Plurality Press, University at Buffalo School of Architecture & Planning, Albright-Knox Art Gallery, Visit Buffalo Niagara, Hispanic Heritage Council of WNY, Literacy New York Buffalo Niagara, Restoration Society, Young Audiences of WNY, Project Flight, Association for a Buffalo Presidential Center, and County of Erie, Home Depot and Townsquare Media.
