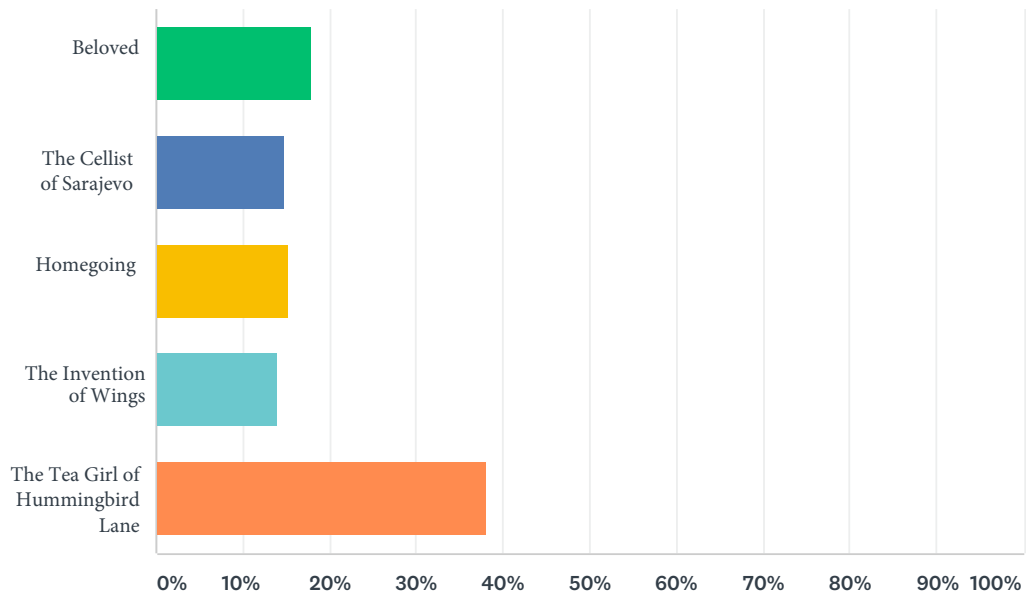







Q1 Which title would you like to see as the featured book for the 2020 One Community One Book initiative? (Select one.)
