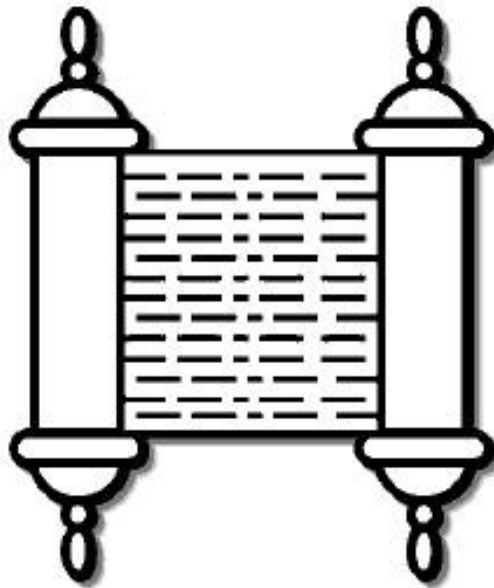

INTRODUCTION

This guide is designed to assist persons researching Jewish genealogy in the Grosvenor Room of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library. Genealogical handbooks, guides, manuals, indexes to record compilations, atlases, maps, gazetteers, surname directories, passenger lists, newspapers, and church records serve numerous purposes and can prove to be invaluable resources to all researchers, regardless of their level of expertise. Most of the materials listed here deal exclusively with Jewish genealogical research.

Nearly everything listed here can be found in the Grosvenor Room (GRO). Material in the Grosvenor Room does not circulate and cannot be removed from the room. In a few cases, there are duplicate copies of these books that can be borrowed from the Central Library non-fiction section or the Closed Stacks.

Personal papers, correspondence, and other items belonging to Leon H. Miller (1880-1939) and Ada Holender Miller of Buffalo, New York ; both Millers were strongly active Zionists both before and after the founding of the State of Israel, and Mrs. Miller was founding president of the Buffalo chapter of Hadassah. The archives include correspondence with Justice Louis D. Brandeis, Henrietta Szold, and other Zionists ; materials on Jewish settlement in British Palestine and in Israel ; financial materials advertising State of Israel bonds and Israeli stock offerings ; materials relating to Hadassah and to the Zionist Organization of America ; and family photographs, jewelry, etc.

SCRAPBOOKS

The Buffalo scrapbooks in GRO were compiled roughly from 1900 to 1960 and are comprised largely of local newspaper clippings and ephemera. All are indexed in the *Local History File*.
