
# Summer 2019 Reading List for Grade 8

#### 1. West Middle school library catalog, Destiny:

- a. <a href="http://libraries.wscschools.org">http://libraries.wscschools.org</a> (choose "West Middle" on right side)
- b. Students may log into the Destiny catalog using their school username and password to search for books. To reset your password during the summer, call the Information Technology department at 677-3832.
- c. Students may check out summer books from the school library in June before school ends and return them in September. E-books and audio books may be checked out any time online in Destiny. The borrowing time is 3 weeks; then the book is automatically returned.
