

Bauer, Joan. Peeled. 2008.


In an upstate New York farming community, high school reporter Hildy Biddle investigates a series of strange occurrences at a house rumored to be haunted.

Crutcher, Chris. The Sledding Hill 2005.




Menzel and D'Aluisio. What the World Eats. 2008.

Spinelli, Jerry. Knots in My Yo-Yo String. 1998.


This Italian-American Newbery Medalist presents a humorous account of his childhood and youth in Norristown, Pennsylvania.
