

INTRODUCTION

October 26, 1825 marked a momentous occasion for the City of Buffalo in New York State. After years of planning and hard labor, the 363-mile long **Erie Canal** was completed. The canal connected waterways in Albany, on the Hudson River, with Buffalo on Lake Erie, and had an immediate effect on transportation, immigration, and commerce in New York State. Travel between New York City and Buffalo became quick and inexpensive. Cities and towns flourished along the canal routes. Buffalo, being the western terminus and strategic Lake Erie port, flourished. By the end of the 19th century, the small village of **Buffalo had grown to the eighth largest city in the United States**.
