Abstract

This collection primarily reflects Troop I during their WWI activities and follows the Troop members as they re-entered civilian life following the war's conclusion. The collection focuses on Troop I, Post 665 from their creation to the dissolution of Troop I, Post 665 following the Covid-19 pandemic. Materials within this collection include newspapers, organization events, membership activities, scrapbooks, and WWI memorabilia.

Materials within the collection have been kept together, with the consideration of original order in mind.

Biographical/Historical Note/Chronology

Focusing on the development and continuation of American Legion Troop I, Post 665, this collection contains materials which serve as physical markers for the ongoing service of veterans. Ranging from 1917-2017, the materials within this collection provides unique insight into the lives of Buffalonians during the First World War, and their subsequent transition into civilian life as veterans and members of the American Legion.

History of the Troop and Post:

Originally forming as a troop on May 7, 1912, Troop I began as 42 men temporarily serving under Colonel Oliver B Bridgeman (of the 1st Calvary New York National Guard) and Captain Sherman S. Jewitt (of Company C 74th Infantry National Guard New York). In October of 1912, Captain William J. Donovan, 1st Lieutenant David T. Dunbar, and 2nd Lieutenant George B. Walbridge were formally elected to command the Troop. In June of 1916, Troop I was called into Federal Service for duty at the Mexican border. During their time at the Mexican border in Texas, the Troop was located at McCallen, Sterling Ranch, Point Isabel, Brownsville, and LaGloria. On March 5, 1916 the Troop was officially terminated, following the end of conflict at the Mexican-American border.

Following the U.S. entering World War I, Troop I was called into service once again officially on July 15, 1917. On July 21, 1917, the Troop was mustered, and consisted of 3 officers and 105 enlisted men, all originating from Buffalo, New York.

On August 13, 1917, Troop I left Buffalo, and formed a full regiment at Bay Ridge, New York. From there, the Troop traveled to Spartanburg, South Carolina, where the regiment was redesignated as the 102nd Trench Mortar Battery and was assigned to the 52nd Field Artillery Brigade of the 27th Infantry Division.

On June 6, 1918, the Battery left Newport News, Virginia for France, where they went on to train at Camp DeSouge (near Bordeaux), and serve at the front lines in France until the Battery was officially released from Federal Service on February 4, 1919.

Upon their arrival home, the members of Troop I went onto create American Legion Post 665, originally located at "Cavalry Farm" at 5980 Old Armor Duells Corners Road in Orchard Park, New York.

The Troop remained at Cavalry Farm until 1939, when the Troop began searching for a new club house and base of operations. Holding a Post meeting at the Elks Club on September 18, 1939, Post members unanimously approved the purchase of the "Hamlin House" at 432 Franklin Street in Buffalo, NY from the German Orpheus Singing Society.

Officially incorporated as American Legion Troop 1, Post 665 by the New York Department of State on November 28, 1939, the Troop remained at the Hamlin House until its sale in 2022, following the Covid-19 pandemic.

Scope and Content

The Troop I, Post 665 Collection includes WWI era newspapers, Post 665 newsletters, scrapbooks, American Legion membership cards, correspondence, documents pertaining to American Legion Post 665 activities, organizational constitutions and by-laws, member photographs, visitor register lists, and meeting minutes. The collection focuses primarily on WWI and the activities of Post 665 from 1919-2019, materials within the collection are connected to veterans affairs, local military and organizational matters, local history, and genealogy.

While the collection focuses primarily on WWI and the activities of Post 665, it should be noted that some of the materials included in the collection relate to military history more broadly. Despite this slight deviation from exclusively Troop I materials, the collection provides context regarding the local importance of American Legion Troop I, Post 665, and displays the history of the Troop itself and the lives of its members.

The collection has been arranged in series, with seven series based on topics.

Arrangement

The collection has been arranged into series by topic and further arranged by boxes and folders on the basis of chronology where applicable. The materials within each series has also maintained original order.

Series I: War Memorabilia (WWI)

Series I (4 boxes) covers the years 1918-1919, the series contains WWI memorabilia including a cavalry rope, commemorative poster, map of France's front lines, and WWI Liberty Bond posters.
