

Get eBooks & eAudiobooks using Libby

Quick Set-up & Basics



Step 1

Download the Libby app from your device's app store or visit libbyapp.com.



Step 2

Open Libby app. Do you have a library card - tap Yes Follow the prompts to find your library. Make sure you choose a Buffalo & Erie County Public Library branch.

Next, tap *This is my Library*.





Tap Enter Library Account Details. Then enter your 13-digit library card number and tap Sign In. Then tap *Next* below the image of your library card.

Step 4

BORROW

PLACE A HOLD

Search for a Book or tap Explore to browse. Tap a book cover to *Borrow* or see more information. If an eBook is checked out, you can *Place a hold*.

Step 5

Open Book

After borrowing to read right away, tap *Open Book* and then tap Libby (this app). Swipe left to turn page. While reading, tap the middle of the screen to adjust settings. More controls are always at the bottom:



To read your current title, tap the middle circle. To view and access all your titles, tap *Shelf*. To search for and add new titles, tap *Library*.

Renew Loan

Return Loan To Library To Return eBooks Early or Renew Title

From your Shelf, tap on Due date within title. Tap the appropriate option and follow prompts.

Policies & Tips

- Buffalo & Erie County Public Library patrons with a valid library card may check out eBooks and eAudiobooks.
- You can use the Libby app on Android Devices. For Kindle Fires and computers you can go to libbyapp.com.
- Customers are limited to 20 titles at a time.
- Items can be checked out for up to 14 days. The default is 7, but you can choose 14 when borrowing.
- You may have up to 10 holds at a time. An email is required to place a hold.
- Titles are automatically borrowed when they become available. You will receive an email when this happens. You may also choose to have a requested title held for 72 hours before you check out.
- Borrowed titles can be renewed a few days before they are due if there are no holds on item.
- Download books and audiobooks for offline reading, or stream them to save space.
- If you prefer reading in your Kindle app, Libby can send your library books to it.
- Positions, bookmarks, and notes are kept in sync across vour devices.
