Discussion ensued about the 2026 budget. Director Dougherty informed the board that the Library System was notified by Erie County, Division of Budget & Management about submitting a "status quo" budget without discretionary spending.

With the uncertainty of Federal funding, and its potential effect on State and county funding, the Erie County Budget Director has asked all County departments and agencies to prepare a "What If" plan for a 10% reduction in County Funding.

Unfortunately, the worst case 10% reduction scenario would result in reductions in various parts of the Library System Budget. Including but not limited to, reduction in open hours, staffing, programming, and library materials. Director Dougherty will be working on budget sheets as they are sent by the System.

#### Williamsville:

Heating issue on May 23 – Building had to close to public while it was being repaired

#### Clearfield:



Interior dripping faucet, exterior hose faucet, and public bathroom door handle repaired by Town. Air conditioning sensor repairs also completed as there were days with cooling issues.

Memorial statue donated by Town and Country Garden Club installed on June 30 (photos of the installation process shared with board members).

Director Kristi Dougherty will research insurance for the garden statues at Williamsville & Clearfield Libraries.

### Audubon:

Adjacent playground opened and door count numbers averaged an increase of several hundred more people per day. Bathroom usage and garbage have also increased, which have led to an updated floor scrubber purchase. Leaking hot water tank and broken automatic opener of front door repaired by town.

Non-functioning hot water tank replaced by Town.
