NEW IN 2020

The Boston Free Library is so much more than books! Beyond the extensive collection of audiobooks, music CDs, DVDs, and Blu-rays, you can now check out a wide range of items at the library. In 2018, the library began circulating yard games including bocce, kan jam, corn hole, badminton, volleyball, croquet, kubb, ladder ball, and giant jenga.

Thanks to a generous grant secured by Senator Gallivan, the library has been able to make several updates and additions to the technology available both at the library and to take home. Beginning in February 2020, the library has expanded its collection to include the following items:

- metal detector
- outdoor projector and screen
- karaoke machine
- video camera
- ukulele
- green screen
- trail camera
- therapy light
- digital radon detector
- telescope
- bubble machine

Patrons will also be able to check out a record player that will convert vinyl records, cassettes, and CDs to a USB flash drive and film converters that can convert film slides, negatives, photos and Super 8 or 8mm film to an SD card. These items will all be available for people to borrow for a 7day loan period with a valid Buffalo & Erie County Public Library adult library card. Items must be picked up and returned at the Boston Free Library.

Also purchased with grant funds, the Boston Free Library now has a 3D printer available for public use. At \$0.05 per gram for finished projects, the price is right to come in and learn how to use this amazing technology.
