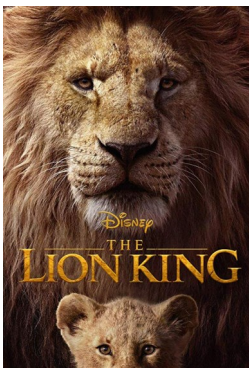


March 5, 5pm — How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World (2019)

As Hiccup (Jay Baruchel) fulfills his dream of creating a peaceful dragon utopia, Toothless' discovery of an untamed, elusive mate draws the Night Fury away. When danger mounts at home and Hiccup's reign as village chief is tested, both dragon and rider must make impossible decisions to save their kind. Also stars America Ferrera, Gerard Butler and Cate Blanchett.

March 12, 5pm — Maleficent: Mistress of Evil (2019)

Maleficent (Angelina Jolie) and her goddaughter Aurora (Elle Fanning) begin to question the complex family ties that bind them as they are pulled in different directions by impending nuptials, unexpected allies and dark new forces. March 19, 5pm — The Lion King (2019)

Simba (JD McCrary) idolizes his father King Mufasa (James Earl Jones) and takes to heart his own royal destiny on the plains of Africa. But not everyone in the kingdom celebrates the new cub's arrival. Scar (Chiwetel Ejiofor), Mufasa's brother, has plans of his own. Pride Rock is soon ravaged by betrayal, tragedy and drama. Now, with help from a curious pair of newfound friends, Simba must figure out how to grow up and take back what is rightfully his. Also stars Beyoncé Knowles-Carter, Seth Rogan and Shahadi Wright Joseph.
