Buffalo & Erie County Public Library Seeks Community Input on Central Library Space Utilization Study

Virtual Public Engagement Session Scheduled for November 5; Survey and Draft Plan Available for Public Review and Comment

BUFFALO, **N.Y.** – **Oct. 29**, **2025** – The Buffalo & Erie County Public Library invites the public to participate in shaping the future of the downtown Central Library through a comprehensive Space Utilization Study.

The downtown Central Library at 1 Lafayette Square serves as the cornerstone of the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library. In an ongoing commitment to better serve patrons, the Library engaged architecture, planning, and design firm Bostwick Design Partnership to conduct a study of the interior of the landmark 400,000-square-foot building.

After months of site visits, staff and patron surveys, and community conversations, the Library has released a public comment draft of the consultant's findings and recommendations. The goal is to create flexible public spaces that enhance the Library's commitment to intellectual freedom and free access – while also becoming a vibrant community destination.

The Library is seeking community engagement through three channels:

- Review of the Central Library Space Utilization Study Public Draft
- Complete the online survey to share input on proposed changes
- Attend the virtual Public Engagement Session on November 5, 2025 at 7:00 PM via Zoom livestream for an overview and Q&A

The final findings will guide informed decisions about needed improvements and renovations. All Erie County residents, library users, and community stakeholders are encouraged to participate.
