Director's Report – Clarence Public Library March 25, 2024

Financial

The financial statements are in the board packets. I have completed the state report statistics and financials and I am currently waiting for authorization to submit. In compiling the state report and going over the numbers from the 2023 ledger, it was discovered that we input the amount for carpet cleaning as \$1250 instead of \$2150. The error was discovered and ledger updated, but not before the Return to System was calculated. In short, we overpaid on our Return to System and will be receiving a \$900 refund check from the Library System. (*The Return to system calculation summarizes the total incoming revenues, including any funds the Clarence Library received during the year from the system and the total direct expenditures for our Library. Our Return to System is the difference between our total incoming revenues and total direct expenditures).



- March 4 Town Engineer Tim Lavocat was at the library with outside Engineer from Rochester for the investigative phase for the new HVAC system. Tim said he would let me know when he has the scope and cost proposal for this initial phase, so that I can get started preparing for the NYS Library Construction Aid grant application.
- We have a group of individuals from Summit Day-Habilitation program volunteering at the library on Tuesdays from 1-2 pm.
- Two students from Clarence High School who are in the VISTA program (Vocational Instruction for Successful Transition to Adulthood) are volunteering at the Clarence Library on Thursday mornings and their main focus is to re-stock the clothing hub in the foyer. The clothing hub has been very popular since we put it back out a month ago!
- We have given out approximately 1200 pairs of eclipse glasses over the past month (February and early March). We received out last shipment of eclipse glasses from

Central on March 11, which was a large shipment of approximately 2000 glasses. They are going fast so I anticipate we might run out before the eclipse.

- Monica and Sarah participated in the Clarence Community Foundation's "International Day of Sharing" event on March 9 at Sto Lat. It was a wonderful event with many people attending. We shared information about the library and our upcoming "Together with Dia" celebration and we offered a friendship bracelet craft for kids.
- We had our annual "Find Limerick the Leprechaun" contest in March and this year are offering a fun prize package that includes stuffed animals, an activity book, a Disney card game, chocolate and a \$25 Amazon gift card.

Upcoming events:

We are currently promoting our "Together with Dia: Children's Day/Book Day event that is scheduled for Saturday, April 20 from 11 am to 3 pm.
