

Items of Note:

Oceans of Possibilities was the summer reading theme this year. The library was "decked" out as a pirate ship and sometimes even a couple of our staff dressed as pirates to go along with the theme. Our program offerings this summer were back to "normal" pre-pandemic level and people were checking out plenty of books and materials. Some of our programs this summer included Miss Sarah's Tuesday and Wednesday story times, a series of art program for kids as well as a Studio Art class for adults. We also brought back family fun nights including Beach Party Magic with Mr. J, Circus Toy Crafting Workshop with Benjamin Berry, Water, Water Everywhere with Nan Hoffman.

Our patrons also had the opportunity to enjoy three free "World of Pollinator" programs presented by Master Gardeners from the Cornell Cooperative Extension. Other regular programs on the schedule were Kidding Around Yoga, Lego Club, D&D Gamespace. We also introduced a new adult program for those interested in playing Mah-Jongg. On August 8, we presented a special program for families—Get a Clue with Nancy Drew. During this program, attendees discovered the history behind the beloved detective and learned what has led to the success of the Nancy Drew series. We had Nancy Drew trivia, a fun and energetic scavenger hunt and finally raffled off Nancy Drew books and memorabilia. Photos from the program were featured on the front Page of the Clarence Bee the following week.

In August and early September, the Clarence Library was one of the drop-off locations for Assemblyman Norris's Peanut Butter and Jelly Drive. Our library a barrel and a half of donations of peanut butter and jelly.

Programs for fall are now underway. Some interesting program we have coming up include Bob Poczik's program on Erik Larson's The Splendid and the Vile, Haunted Graham Cracker House afterschool craft and Wind-Down Yoga with Mari Fox, a program designed to get children relaxed and wind down after a long day at school. We also have Mike Hawley and Kevin Gallivan returning for a second installment of Sherlock Holmes vs. Jack the Ripper. This event, featuring an expert on the Ripper murders and an expert on Sherlock Holmes will take place October 17 at 6:30 pm. Our fall book sale is scheduled to begin the following week on October 26.

Building/Maintenance – We are still waiting for entry mat installment; it was scheduled to take place on 9/21 but will be rescheduled in the near future. I also received word from Mid-City Office Furniture that there is an issue getting some of the material for lounge furniture we ordered and it is not scheduled to ship until 11/14 (a 2-1/2 month delay from the original ship date 9/1).
