#### YEAR IN REVIEW... 2021

After all of the changes brought about in 2020, this year the library really looked at what was working, what our patrons wanted, and what services we could offer. In February, we were able to increase our hours to 35 per week.

The Library is still offering curbside pickup for those who would like things from the library without coming inside. Call to set up a pick up appointment!

We continued to offer videos and crafts on Facebook and YouTube for our patrons, and we started carefully resuming in-person programs. Two of the



Book Clubs have resumed with masks and social distancing. At the end of the CRAFTING year, we resumed our Adult Craft The Classes in person, and also offered them with Take and Make kits and vid-

eo instructions. For kids, we are now offering Lego Club, Story Art programs, and Take and Make Craft kits, as well as summer reading events, and are looking forward to expanding our programming in 2022.

Our Library of Things expanded again this year! We now offer items such as adult snowshoes, an Instant Pot, and more. Check out our demo videos on Facebook or YouTube to learn more about what you can borrow!





This year we were excited to start our Sports Equipment Share and the "Play Down Your Fines" Program. Patrons can check out equipment like basket ball, lacrosse, or snowshoe sets, and

if kids 16 and under have fees on their accounts, they will be removed!

We continue to work with Erie County to distrib-

ute COVID supplies provided by the county.

The Board of Trustees has moved their meetings online, still open to the public via virtual attendance and posted recording, and meets regularly



to on topics like safety protocols for our building.

Another exciting project is all of the construction at the library! This summer we were able to replace



our leaking roof, and in 2022 we will be upgrading all of our lights to energy saving LED fixtures that will save electricity and money. We

were able to accomplish this with the Town of Collins, along with the New York State Library Construction Grant Program, and funds from NYS Assemblyman David DiPietro.

New on the technology front, we are now offering mobile printing. Ask for details next time you're in! Wi-fi is always available in and outside the library for your personal devices 24/7. From the library's website you can find eBooks, eAudiobooks, & databases free with your library card. We have more new and exciting projects in 2022, so stay tuned!

This year the library developed a Long-Range Plan for the next five years. We used input from our patrons, staff, and trustees to develop where the library is headed, and steps we want to take to get there.
