We expect cuts to library funding next year, but don't entirely know how they will affect us.

We're currently making plans for many eventualities. Central is asking us to try to reduce our staffing budgets as much as we can this year to roll those funds into offsetting

Next year's possible budget cuts.

The county, that doesn't affect us, is asking all the permits to make a 13% cut to their budgets, and the library system is asking the contracting member libraries to try to make a similar reduction.

Without federal assistance, the budget impact for 2021 could be as much as 25%.
