D'YOUVILLE CAMPUS PORTER SCHOOL WINS DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. "LEADERS ARE READERS" SCHOOL AWARD FOR LITERACY

"A book can change the way a person looks at the world."

Local non-profit Project Flight, in partnership with the Governor's Office, the Office of Children and Family Services, the Office of MWBE and Community Relations of the New York State Office of General Services, and the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, is proud to recognize Buffalo Public School #3 D'Youville Porter Campus School as the winner of the 2020 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. "Leaders Are Readers" literacy initiative.

Project Flight, which works to promote literacy throughout the Western New York area and the world, founded the statewide initiative in 2004. Buffalo & Erie County Public Libraries have historically been the purveyors of literacy for all who walk through their doors and became a partner in the initiative in 2014.

This year's winning school will receive over 5,000 books worth over \$100,000. Along with the promise to promote literacy in school and at home, the D'Youville Porter Campus School will provide programming that promotes Dr. King's vision of equality and justice through literacy. The school will also strengthen their relationship with the

Isaías González-Soto Branch Library, located at 280 Porter Ave., across the street from the school campus.

Project Flight works to ensure every child has a book of their own and can read at grade level. They believe that, whether at home or at school, children should live in a literate environment and that literacy is an entree out of poverty. This is a special concern in Buffalo, where almost 50 percent of children live in poverty.

"Our vision is to make sure all children will increase their aptitude in literacy to gain a wealth of knowledge that will spread throughout their lives and to their families," said Project Flight Co-Director, Dr. Geraldine Bard.

"Education uplifts the power to fulfill dreams," added Project Flight Co-Director, Dr. Elizabeth Cappella. "The legacy of literacy is democracy and freedom."

"Having access to books allows children to open their imagination, expand their creativity and explore their interests," said Library Director Mary Jean Jakubowski. "Reading supports the notion that learning can be fun. The more you read, the more you know, and the more you grow. The possibilities are infinite."

This year's selection committee was made up of Chair Ms. Jakubowski, Dr. Cappella and Dr. Bard.
