## Buffalo & Erie County Public Library System Teams Up with Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda Schools to Expand Access to eBooks and eAudioBooks

Shared goal to provide digital materials in the community, especially during remote learning

BUFFALO, N.Y. – February 2021 – As educators seek more creative ways to support students' learning, a key resource for schools is the local public library. Now, <u>Buffalo & Erie</u> <u>County Public Libraries</u> and <u>Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda Schools</u> have formed an innovative new partnership to increase students' access to eBooks and eAudioBooks by combining the library's and school's digital reading resources in one app.

The library-school partnership provides safe access to thousands of age-appropriate titles for students' use inside the classroom, at home and anywhere 24/7. Through <u>Sora</u>, the student reading app for Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda Schools, students can now borrow from the school's collection of classroom and pleasure reading as well as from Buffalo & Erie County Public Library's children's and young adult digital collection. Students can easily log into the library's digital collection through Sora using their school credentials rather than requiring a separate library card. In addition, Sora supports teachers by offering classroom-specific tools like measuring achievements, exporting notes, and tracking reading progress to encourage individualized learning.

"Public library and school partnerships bring tremendous resources together that strengthen community commitment by providing students access to educational tools that enrich, enlighten and entertain," said Library System Director Mary Jean Jakubowski. "We are grateful to the Ken-Ton School District, as well as other local schools, for their partnership in providing access to our eResources through the Sora reading app. Our hope is that other schools will do so as well. The Sora app was named one of *TIME*'s Best Inventions 2019 and is available for Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda Schools students to download through the Apple App Store and Google Play Store, and on Chromebooks that support the Google Play Store. It is also available for use in web browsers at <u>https://soraapp.com</u> on any computer.

Erie County residents can also download and read Buffalo & Erie County Public Library's complete eBook and eAudioBook collection with their free library card through the award-winning Libby app. The Library's locally selected collection offers digital books including bestsellers and new releases. Readers of all ages can select from every subject ranging from mystery to romance, children's, business and more. Libby can be used on any major device or computer, including Apple <sup>(R)</sup>, Android<sup>™</sup>, Chromebook<sup>™</sup> and Kindle<sup>(R)</sup> (U.S. only).
