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SUMMER READING FUN @ BUFFALO & ERIE COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARIES

Free, Family-Friendly Programs to Keep Kids Reading During the Summer Months

Summer is almost here, and the Buffalo & Erie County Public Libraries want you to take a walk on the wild side with this year's Summer Reading *Tails and Tales* activities. Now through the end of August, everyone is encouraged to visit their local public library to learn about and explore the marvels of the natural world through books, virtual and in-library programs, outdoor activities, online reading challenges and crafts for all ages. The 37 local libraries and the *Library on Wheels* Bookmobile are open and ready to shine the light on a variety of resources and programs including family-friendly reading contests, book clubs, pet programs, teen reading competitions, computer coding, DIY crafts, comedy shows, outdoor games, yoga, concerts and more!

"Libraries are here to help prevent what is commonly known as the 'summer slide'," said Library System Director Mary Jean Jakubowski. "Because traditional classroom learning has changed over the last year, it is now more important than ever for parents to encourage year-round reading. Plus, Library staff are available to help select age-appropriate reading and learning materials."

Highlights of the free *Tails and Tales* programming at the Buffalo & Erie County Public Libraries include:

Tails and Tales Summer Reading Challenge: Children, teens and adults who read a book, write a short review and post it online on the Library's Summer Reading Challenge page are entered to win prizes including a Kindle Fire HD 10 Tablet. The Challenge runs through Friday, August 13. Click here for details: http://becplny08.readsquared.com/

Read Down Your Fines: Children ages 16 and under are able to read down their fines. For every 15 documented minutes of reading, a child earns one Library Buck toward reducing overdue fines. Once a summer-only program, this opportunity has been extended and is now available year-round.

Take & Make Activities: While in-person programs may still be limited in some libraries this summer, many are offering inspiring and creative Do-It-Yourself (DIY) craft and learning kits that can be picked up and assembled at home! Activities vary by library, while supplies last.

Maker Camp Learning Kits: The downtown Buffalo Central Library and Buffalo Branch Libraries will offer STEM activity kits with additional "how to" programming posted on the Library's Facebook and YouTube sites during select weeks in July and August. Projects such as making instant snow, designing your own zoo, experimenting with clay circuits and

growing your own herb garden will be featured. Target audience is children ages 8 – 12. Maker Camp is generously funded by National Grid.

Battle of the Books. This popular team trivia competition for youth entering grades 6 through 9 is back as a virtual event (with a special, one-year-only extension to grade 10!) Contact a participating library (Amherst, Boston, Central, Clarence, Elma, Grand Island, Lancaster, Newstead, North Park or Orchard Park) to join a team. Registration closes Friday, July 9, but may end earlier if teams reach capacity. Battles will take place virtually between July 30 and August 3, with the winner announced on the Central Library's Facebook page on Saturday, August 7 at 12 noon.

The *Library on Wheels* Bookmobile will be on the road this summer, providing an additional way to borrow and return materials, access free Wi-Fi and more. Check out its scheduled stops <a href="https://example.com/here/be

Catch us at the *Buffalo Waterfront (Canalside)* twice each week! Tuesdays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. from June 29 – August 24 when we feature a different Summer Reading theme. Attendees can sign up for a library card or pick up take & make crafts. On Wednesdays from June 23 – August 25 from 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., the Library is partnering with Every Person Influences Children (EPIC) for "Storytime at Canalside: A Bicentennial Celebration" focusing on celebrating the 200 year history of Erie County, with special guest readers and weekly themes. Youth Sports Equipment Lending and **Play Down Your Fines.** Soccer, lacrosse, basketball, tennis and other outdoor activity kits are available for borrowing at the following libraries: Isaías González-Soto Branch, Leroy R. Coles, Jr. Branch, Elaine M. Panty Branch and the downtown Central Library in Buffalo; the Anna Reinstein Memorial Library in Cheektowaga; Lackawanna Public Library; Newstead Public Library; and the Town of Collins Public Library. Youth sports lending and *Play Down Your Fines* (offering removal of all fines and fees for children when they borrow the sports kits) is in partnership with the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation, the Penguin Random House Library Award and the Dolce Firm, Attorneys at Law.
