June 24, 2025, 6:00 p.m.

President Adam Zaremski called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

- 1. There were no comments from the audience.
- 2. A motion (KSC, SR) to approve the Minutes of the May 27th meeting was carried by a voice vote.
- 3. A motion (KSC, AZ) to approve the Treasurer's Report: Monthly Financial Statements, Internal Auditor, & Contingency Fund Reports: May 2025 was carried by a voice vote.
  - Discussion on the donation of \$250 Aurora Women's club. They have made donations over the years.
- 4. A motion (KSC, SR) to approve the Director's Report: May 2025 was carried by a voice vote.
  - Circulation and foot traffic increased year over year. There were increased maintenance
    expenses incurred this month. Friends undertook gardening work outside the library. A
    new scanner was purchased by the Friends and it is available for public use. The old
    scanner will be used by the office.
  - The public has offered positive feedback on the amount of programs that are being offered this summer. Ausberger anticipates an increase in foot traffic for the summer due to the additional programming.

#### 5. Reports of Interest

- Pizza Del Aureo's raised \$734.57 in support of the Friends of the Aurora Town Public Library, donating 10% of sales from June 9, 2025. Ausberger thanked the business and Aures family personally, on social media, and in the local newspapers for their continued support of the library.
- ATPL is participating in the Climate Smart Community Task Force, "Scoot Around June" to encourage patrons to bike or walk to the library, promoting a healthy community and a cleaner environment. Prizes will be raffled off at the 3rd of July Fireworks.
- The Discard Sale raised \$1,335.31 after taxes. Leftovers from the Discard Sale were donated to Catholic Charities. Materials were also offered to WNY Education Alliance, EPIC, and Parent Network of WNY, but these organizations were unable to accept the materials.
- During July, when patrons of all ages check out at least five items, they earn a free chance to win two free admissions to the Buffalo Museum of Science. One winner will be randomly selected on Monday, July 28th at 6:00 p.m.
- The East Aurora Art Society has generously sponsored the purchase of unfinished 6" barrels for a fundraiser in collaboration with the Friends of the Aurora Town Public Library. Each barrel will be hand-painted and embellished by a talented local artist.

From June 2 through August 1, the barrels will be displayed and the community is invited to buy votes to judge and earn a chance to win their favorite barrels. Ausberger anticipates that more tickets will be sold in the coming weeks since the fundraiser is taking place during the summer when there is increased foot traffic.

# Rationale

The Aurora Town Public Library is seeking to create a Teen Action Group (TAG) in Fall 2025 for the following reasons:

- To improve teen programming, increase teen attendance at events, and keep teens connected to the library at a critical age.
- To respond to community concerns about a lack of inclusive spaces for young people of color and other marginalized groups in East Aurora,
- To offer opportunities for youth to "have an impact" in the community, develop leadership skills, and connect with organizations in East Aurora.

#### Year 1 SMART Goals

Goals	Challenges
Recruitment: To recruit at least 10 members.	As this group has never existed before, we may not get a lot of interest without targeted advertising. Using the summer volunteer program to identify what will draw teens interest to participate in the group.
Meetings: To hold no less than 1 meeting per month between Sept '25 and June '26.	There are two potential risks with meetings, one is finding dates/times that will work for all members, the second is ensuring the availability of the library space. Getting all meetings for the year set up in the first orientation meeting and publishing the schedule will be a top priority.
Retention: To retain 50% of members after 6 months.	Finding ways to keep teens interested and returning to the group is a key component to this project. Research indicates that the more "ownership" we can help members feel over both the group and the programs, the more invested they will feel in making sure we meet our goals. Establishing a clear communications strategy will be essential.
Programming: To offer at least one unique program or event every four months.	Helping the group establish SMART goals for their programs, which should also fall within the library's scope, will be a huge part of the "guidance" offered by the librarian facilitator.
Attendance: To raise the participation for teen programs to 75% capacity by June 2026.	This is the key challenge that the TAG has been created to address. It can be assumed that by addressing the challenges outlined elsewhere, attendance will improve.

# Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)



#### What is the Library Leaders program?

The Aurora Town Public Library's Library Leaders (LL) program has been designed to help teens become college ready by developing their leadership skills, and volunteering in our community.

Library Leaders will have the opportunity to design and participate in programs that:

- Share important information with the community in East Aurora.
- Offer new library events and programs for teens.
- Assist with library events and programs.
- Recommend new library materials for our collection.
- Help people-in-need in East Aurora.

Who should get involved? Why?	Library Leaders is open to all teens between the ages of 13-18 who haven't graduated from high school.
When and where will we meet?	Library Leaders will meet on Tuesday evenings once a month for one hour at the Aurora Town Public Library. Participants will also have the option to sign up for volunteering opportunities to complete service learning hours at the library that will be no more than two hours at a time.
How will it work?	The Library Leaders will be primarily engaged in two activities: (1) completing community service hours through volunteering, and (2) developing their own teen programs here at the library.

#### 1. Community Service at the Library

Every month during our meeting, Library Leaders will have the opportunity to sign up for volunteering shifts here at the library, for no more than two hours at a time.

Volunteers will have the opportunity to...

- Assist with library programming, including Children's Story time, crafting nights, and others.
- Help with the preparations or clean up from programs.
- Create fun decorations and displays for the library space.
- Participate in the service learning activities chosen by the Library Leaders group.

#### 2. Library Leaders Teen Programs

This year we will be offering two Teen Programs created by the Library Leaders group:

- Program #1 for January 2026: Working from October 2025 January 2026
- Program #2 for May 2026: Working from February May 2026

**Examples of programs:** Dungeons and Dragons Night, Make Your Own Spa Night, Poetry Writing Workshop, LGBTQ Pride Party, Amigurumi Crochet Creations, Board Game Night, and many more!

# Petty Cash Fund Policy PETTY CASH FUND POLICY

This policy applies to the Aurora Town Public Library, a contracting member library of the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library.

The Board of Trustees of the Aurora Town Public Library (ATPL) establishes has established a petty cash fund for the purpose of paying small cash amounts to be spent on the incidental needs of the Library. Items purchased will then be charged back to the appropriate account.

- The Library Director and Senior Library Clerk shall be responsible for the management of the petty cash account.
- The petty cash fund may be maintained at no more than \$500.00 from Library's the ATPL's private local funds checking account.
- The Senior Library Clerk shall maintain receipts and bookkeeping records for the petty cash account, which will be reviewed by the Library Director.

#### Procedures:

- Use of Petty Cash must be pre-approved by the Library Director, or in the event the Director is absent, the Full-Time Librarian.
- A receipt for cash must be completed, stating date, name, amount, and purpose for the money.
   When the item is purchased, the actual receipt and change will be returned to the fund. Both the receipt for cash and the purchase receipt will be kept with all other financial papers as required by the NY New York State Retention Law.
- All purchases made on behalf of the Library are tax-exempt, and a tax exemption form will be provided to all vendors at the time of sale.
- Funds will be disbursed to the person who purchased the item(s) by the Senior Library Clerk. In the event the Senior Library Clerk is absent, the Director or Full-Time Librarian shall assume those duties.
- The Director and Senior Library Clerk will prepare a monthly financial report to be presented to the Board on the day of their regular monthly meeting. The period covered by the report shall include records of purchases made in the calendar month prior to before the meeting.
- The fund will be counted by the Senior Library Clerk and reviewed by the Library Director.
