

Cyrenius Chapin: Buffalo's First Physician and War of 1812 Hero

Dr. Chapin arrived in Buffalo in 1803 blessed with a forceful personality, infuriating gall, and a caring nature. A determined Federalist, he argued with Joseph Ellicott of the Holland Land Company, raised a family, trained countless apprentices, and called Seneca Chief Red Jacket his friend. Being the last man to fire a cannon at the British before Buffalo was burned, he spent most of 1814 as a prisoner of war. Pneumonia struck him down in 1838 following his third attempt to drive the British out of Canada. His was an age of revolutions and a time when national independence and self-determination were inseparable.

Dr. Rosenthal also edited the Journal of Rural Health, and the textbook Office Based Geriatrics. He has been honored with numerous local, statewide and national awards in medical education.
