the expected amount of revenue that

they're asking us to try to achieve this

year is eight thousand two hundred and

twelve dollars

16:57

so breaking it down i'd have to make six

16:59

hundred eighty four dollars a month

17:01

to to reach that goal um

17:04

we're in march i don't see us reaching

17:06

back

so um basically at the me at the 17:10 manager's meeting yesterday 17:12 ken said we know that that the cash that 17:15 there's a cash flow problem 17:16 we know you know you guys are not going to probably be able to hit to hit these 17:20 targets 17:20 it's okay um when you get close to the 17:23 end of the year 17:24 call us you know we'll work with you 17:25 we'll figure out you know 17:27 what what needs to be adjusted right so 17:29 so basically 17:30 they they know it's an issue they're not 17:33 going to 17:34 penalize us for it so i'm going to try 17:36 to get as close to this as possible this 17:38 year 17:39 but it's it's just not 17:43 with the way that everything's going i 17:44 don't think it's going to be realistic 17:47 so i want to make you guys aware of this 17:48

to the art studio that you did that

is that um i'm going to

for the library

the central library last month they

26:38

chose our location for a wi-fi

expansion project to extend the range on

26:43

the wi-fi signal into the parking lot

26:45

um so external access points were

installed on the outside of the building

26:49

on february 10th

26:50

uh approval was given by the town and

26:52

funding was received

26:54

by central through the institute of

26:56

museums and library services

26:58

uh it was it was a caribaka brand so we

27:01

didn't have to pay anything i didn't

27:02

have to do anything except

27:04

ask the town to make sure that it was

27:05

okay they would put holes in the

27:07

building so they could put the

27:08

you know the lines through and all that

27:10

um i drove around in my car the next day

27:12

and the signal actually goes all the way

27:14

past the snack shack

27:16

wow so i really agree and that's

27:19

something that i wanted for for a few

27:20

years so

27:21

the extra sweet addition to the fact

27:24

that the town didn't have to pay

27:25

anything and the library didn't have to

27:26

pay anything

so so i don't know i don't know if the

27:30

town wants to wants to

27:31

write a letter to ken stone but

27:35

we we didn't anticipate the signal being

27:39

that strong

27:41

but i anticipate that'll be a real gift

27:44

for people who are there for grand

27:46

island soccer or little league

27:48

so uh i can't place it that far jen i

27:51

think it'll make it over to the

27:53

miracle league too okay

27:56

great so yeah we could um certainly

27:58

draft something

28:00

to show the appreciation there you and i

28:02

and dick can work on that

28:04

and i'll we'll do something from the

28:05

town board but yeah that's that'll be

really nice for our residents

before we go on with the whistle blower

28:14

compliance report we're

28:17

postponing this until may when we review

the policy but you can't report on it

and and and um

agree on the policy at the same time 28:29 right 28:30 yeah it'll be just an old overall 28:32 general discussion about everything 28:35 okay so so like on the minutes we will 28:38 do this in may when we review the policy 28:40 correct okay i just wanted to make sure 28:44 because 28:45 i was wondering how we could do them 28:48 both like you know to have a report and 28:51 review the policy at the same time but i 28:54 get it now 28:55 all right sorry 28:59 okay the 2020 returned the system 29:04 i'm having a really hard time hearing 29:06 new bridget i turned up my sound 29:09 and i could hear everyone else's like 29:11 booming but i can't 29:12 have i can't have a hard time with you 29:15 all right i'll i'll lean in a little 29:16 more 29:17 i tried other microphones and stuff and i just i just can't get it to be louder

covet and the amount of money that we

29:46

didn't make i felt that was a little

29:48

high so went through checked with

29:50

financials from the last few years

29:52

realized um somewhere between

29:57

2016 and now like the financials were

29:59

off a little bit like we were off by

30:01

like

30:01

232 i actually overpaid the last two

30:04

years because

30:05

that wasn't i didn't catch them from now

30:07

luckily it was a small amount

um so i got them i got the business

30:11

office to adjust the return to system

30:14

so it's now actually on 1957.6 and 69

30:20

so the problem lays in the fact that

30:22

there's not enough money in the county

30:23

account to cover this bill right now

30:25

um because january bills came up um

30:29

some bills from from december cleared in

30:31

january

30:32

so you know so i i have to build this up

30:34

more before i can go and give back

30:36

so uh ken stone responded

30:40

uh he sent an email to myself to

30:42

configure and do crawford

30:44

um basically he says it's a cash flow

30:47

issue which is a system-wide problem

30:49

because you know

30:50

directly because of coded um let's see

30:53

he says

30:55

i just want to make sure i'm using his

30:56

words and not not my own paraphrasing

30:58

correctly because obviously you want to

31:02

be able to pay your water bill so

um we believe the simplest way to handle

31:06

this is to hold off on paying the system

31:08

return

31:09

until you have more than sufficient cash

31:11

cash on hand

31:12

including a cushion if that takes until

31:14

june or even later

31:16

that's okay just let us know you can

31:18

also temporarily transfer cash from

31:20

other accounts

31:21

to cover a cash shortage in your

31:23

operating account and then returning

31:25

whatever you you took from that account

31:29

to it once the cash shortage is

31:33

fixed so basically we can either see

31:36

where we stand in july

31:38

if we picked up enough revenue for me to

31:40

cover this bill as well

31:41

as well as any other like you know other

31:44

utility bills

31:45

that are coming in or we can try to pay

31:47

it out of private or

31:49

money market and then and then pay that

back later

31:53

so so this is the this is the discussion
