four is arts entertainment and 12:34 recreation education it's the general 12:39 gist that the libraries do fit in there 12:41 however we we could fit into retail if 12:45 it got approved if we offer curbside 12:47 service which I'm totally down with and 12:50 there's all kind of all kinds of 12:51 protocols first for safety and such and 12:53 how to actually do this but that has to 12:57 be approved on this on the state and 12:59 county level before and anything would 13:01 go with that 13:03 and then the plan further goes into 13:06 there's four phases of reopening once we 13:10 do get the okay to go the first phase is 13.14 a pre opening plan 13:17 which would be at we get to that ok 13:24

first stage would be at 25% staff so 13:26 I've been told what that means for the 13:29 Grand Island library we have 17 people 13:31 on staff over there that would be no 13:33 more than four staff members in the 13:34 building at the same time so what that 13:37 means is a change in scheduling 13:39 schedules could not overlap they'd have 13:42 to be you know what but it up to each 13:45 other with the first wave leaving and 13:47 then the second wave coming in and 13:50 basically we would still be close to the 13:53 public this is where the curbside 13:54 service would come in would be on stage 13:56 one of this plan as well as yes does it 14:00 include Harold yes okay so definitely 14:11

especially since in the first part here

thorough thoroughly cleaning the

building with hospital-grade 14:16
disinfectant and basically making sure 14:19
that the building is ready to be in use 14:23
once we move on to the further stages 14:27
anybody going into a restaurant knows 14:30
what this looks like basically they've 14:32
got all the furniture over in the corner 14:35
it's roped off because they're trying to 14:37
you know for obvious reasons discourage 14:39
people from from meeting in groups 14:41
computers would be and basically that 14:46
they wouldn't exist for the public 14:46
during this stage everything would be 14:48
staff in the building prepping the 14:50
building and then offering some some 14:53
kind of curbside service any questions 14:55

on stage one just by looking at this 14:57 roof you know yeah you know it seems 15:00 kind of funny I can see you know 15:02 cleaning in between people using things 15:04 and touching things to have to disinfect 15:07 the whole building when nobody's been 15:09 there first oh you're sweet keep in mind 15:13 with that Jill um this is also a 15:15 possibility of having our book drop back 15:16 open okay which means that I'm possibly 15:19 contaminated stuff would be coming back 15:21 into the building and I the system 15:24 they've actually created a new materials 15:26 handling protocol and that would involve 15:29 quarantine items 15:30 as they come in for a certain amount of 15:32 time they're saying 72 hours is their 15:35

recommendation there won't be any 15:38 programming for a while so basically our 15:41 meeting room in this plan would it would 15:43 end up being a quarantine stage staging 15:46 area for materials as they come back 15:55 dick you're back on you're unmuted okay 15:59 thank you 16:00 yep a Brigid related to Jill's question 16:04 if no one's been in there and you're 16:07 going to quarantine the book drop stuff 16:09 in the meeting room mm-hmm 16:11 what's the reason to spend all that time 16:14 disinfecting things where it doesn't 16:17 maybe I'm missing something but uh um 16:19 keep keep in mind this is the this is 16.21 like extreme draft format option marry 16:25 genus this this is not a final document 16:27

okay Mary Jean is actually still looking 16:30

for feedback so I want as much feedback 16:32

from you guys as possible today because 16:34

she wants that by tomorrow at noon okay 16:38

and then I'll work on another draft and 16:47

so if it's a non-porous book like a 16:52

hardcover book because a lot of our our 16:54

books have plastic covers on them what 16:57

we were doing before we closed was we 16:59

were using a diluted alcohol solution 17:03

he's bringing on it and wiping them off 17:05

so we were doing that for the hardcover 17:07

books we were doing that for the DVDs 17:09

for the paperbacks or anything porous we 17:12

had to put them in cardboard boxes put a 17:14

date on them and then put them aside in 17:16

quarantine for a while at that point it 17:18

was ten days but under this current plan 17:21 and current guidelines they're saying 72 17:25 hours but those cover books nothing's 17:29 being done about the pages right and and 17:32 keep in mind that that was the procedure 17:34 before all this started and we know we 17:37 know a lot more now than we did back 17:39 then two months ago so basically the the 17:42 materials handling 17:44 at this point would be everything would 17:46 be going on on a table in the meeting 17:48 room and it would sit for it for 72 17:50 hours I guess from from the centers 17:53 centers for disease control that they 17:55 were stating that the best sanitizer 17:58 types of materials is time and that's 18:03 why I was asking why would you spend the 18:04

time to you know deep clean the whole 18:07 building when it's already had all sorts 18:10 of self quarantine here 18:12 the date is unwrapped as well this this 18:16 this was what we were working with a 18:19 week ago excuse me and another point 18:24 that Mary Jean brought up when she was 18:27 talking to the at board was that if you 18:30 need a place to store books while 18:32 they're in quarantine the conference 18:35 rooms and meeting rooms for libraries 18:37 may be used so there's going to be right 18:40 back and forth it's a it's a good safety 18:43 precaution to do it um if I could just 18:50 interject something Bridget um I'm 18:52 wondering if other libraries in their 18:55 relationship with their school districts 18:57

have thought of this yet since many 18:59 school districts are closing until 19:01 September 1 and things are limited I 19:03 know a lot of them invested in in many 19:05 cases multiple of the machines that do a 19:09 disinfecting of a very large room so 19:11 they've made these purchases of these 19:14 machines they do awful disinfection of a 19:17 large amount of square footage and I'm 19:20 guessing that they're currently not 19:23 utilizing those at least as much as they 19:26 were so I didn't know if there was talk 19:28 between the school districts and the 19:31 neighborhood libraries at all to 19:33 possibly rent or utilize those to make 19:36 effective use of time remember hearing 19:40 about anything like that at all I'm 19:42

jotting it down yeah so if you were to 19:45 bring it up at a larger library meeting 19:47 I'm sure some people say oh yeah we 19:48 started on the news most districts 19:50 purchased a couple of them and probably 19:52 like I said the curve of using them now 19:55 versus previous months or 19:57 in September there might if if your 20:00 phase one ends up happening over the 20:02 summer time it might be something to 20:04 pursue on a large scale some kind of 20:05 partnership or rental on that just 20:07 thrown it out there to look into yeah no 20:09 I'll definitely forward that to our 20:12 tourist system director because I didn't 20:13 even know that technology like that 20:14 existed okay Stage two of the internal

reopening plan would be at 25 to 50 to 20:32 50 percent staff I believe for Grand 20:34 Island that that would be um no more 20:36 than was it twelve people 20:38 no it was eight no more than eight staff 20:40 members in the building at the same time 20:43 basically that this is where social 20:47 social distancing would come in a little 20:49 more they would we would open up the 20:51 building to the public we have to be 20:53 extremely limited based on current based 20:55 on executive orders at that time and 20:57 we'd be able to start circulating 21:00 materials over the desk again 21:02 at this point the libraries is 21:05 purchasing masks and gloves and rubbing 21:07 alcohol hands hand sanitizer they're 21:10

also purchasing keyboard covers so it it 21:13 puts it puts a plastic barrier over the 21:15 cover so we can wipe them down more 21:17 effectively without damaging anything I 21:20 did a keyboard count the other day 21:22 basically we have there's 20 computers 21:27 in the library it would cut it down to 21:30 12 and that includes staff so I have 21:34 five computers for the staff to use and 21:36 there would be six I'm sorry seven 21:42 computers for the public my math may be 21:46 me but it would be cut down a lot yeah 21:52 it would be stiff checkout not self 21:55 checkout right both both we would be 21:59 able self check yeah luckily our two 22:01 self checkouts are far far enough 22:03 apart that I can still keep them on oh 22:06

okay I thought it was something about 22:08 like touching you know because 22:10 you know there they try to make 22:14 everything touchless now like even with 22:16 curbside pickup no because he even even 22:19 with the cell checks I I have it is a 22:21 touchscreen computer so this is your 22:33 meeting room use restricted to 22:35 limitations as set forth by state and 22:37 county officials basically I'm gonna go 22:41 with the bullet point after that no 22:43 program schedules and no group gathering 22:46 so if I'm using the meeting room as as a 22:49 quarantine area for our materials 22:52 there's going to be no public use of 22:54 that meeting room until the library 22:55 opens and we get okay which means Mary 22:58

I'm gonna have to have a meeting with 22:59 you and the Friends board and we're 23:01 gonna have to talk about where you guys 23:02 fit into all this 23:03 because I've also been told if we 23:05 already use volunteers that would count 23:07 against the the staff members and in the 23:10 building so and and at this point 23:13 because this is so all over the place 23:15 I'd rather not I have volunteers in you 23:21 know just because I just don't know 23:23 enough yet to keep to keep everybody you 23:26 know 100% safe I have another question 23:29 yeah so if you could do self checkout is 23:34 are the sticks gonna be open or are 23:37 they're gonna be closed sticks where you 23:39 request your book and it's you know some 23:42

retrieves it for you I don't know the 23:45 answer to that yet basically but when I 23:48 go shopping at the stores 23:49 I'm keeping I'm keeping my eyes open to 23:52 see how they're doing stuff I look at 23:55 how Walmart's doing things every other 23:57 aisle they have a red square that says 23:59 do not go down and then the one next to 24:02 it there's a green triangle it says 24:03 enter this way so they're doing a flow 24:05 pattern with their with their aisles 24:07 that is that is a possibility that might 24:12 be something I'll tell Mary Jean as well 24:14 my concern is that they probably him 24:17 because they have own store security 24:19 cameras they could tell what's going 24:23 and like aisle three or whatever people 24:26

are you know congregating there or 24:29 whatever and they could send someone 24:31 over to politely but in a library it's 24:35 kind of hard to know especially when we 24:37 don't have our cameras yet we don't have 24:40 cameras and we don't have full staff 24:44 another possibility to rope off the 24:47 stacks and just just have it be a staff 24:49 area based on what what people are 24:52 asking for that is another possibility I 24:55 think when we do curbside service 24:56 that'll be the benchmark for how we move 25:00 into reopening so figure out curbside if 25:03 that works still offer curbside when 25:06 we're allowed to go to go to stage two 25:07 so that way it still gives gives people 25:09 you know an option to get things but

they don't have to come into the 25:13 building if they don't if they don't 25:14 want to I really think this whole 25:16 exercise is going to change the way that 25:19 that we do stuff over here 25:24 the concern really isn't the 25:27 congregating eye that is a concern but I 25:30 think the major concern is when you you 25:32 you don't know exactly what book you 25:34 want or what the tape or CD you want so 25:37 you may you may pull out five or six 25:40 different ones and then put them back in 25:42 and those tapes or books could be 25:45 contaminated that's where I think we 25:48 should hopefully we'll have a good 25:51 curbside service and we've had some 25:54 experience with it obviously with a

carpet situation and III think that's 25:59 the safest way of doing it yeah maybe if 26:04 you were going to let people browse you 26:07 hand out a pair or a disposable gloves 26:09 and the gloves are required while 26:12 they're handling the books and then you 26:14 have a disposal container right at the 26:16 checkout desk and you peel your gloves 26:18 off after that yeah my concern with that 26:23 is that we're gonna have limited 26:25 supplies for the staff so I would prefer 26:29 not not to get into providing items for 26:32 for the public on really at this point 26:35 restaurants have have been 26:37 throughout you know limited throughout 26:39

this whole thing stores have been most

people should should have those things

26:41

already if they're out and about and 26:44 doing things you know I I understand 26:51 this concern about browsing but you know 26:55 I think this is going this whole 26:57 experience is gonna change everybody's 27:00 frame of mind yeah because you could 27:02 browse online also that you know so I 27:06 think that people will you know start 27:08 thinking about what they want and you 27:12 know kind of browse online and amazingly 27:15 like let's say that you get an e D from 27:18 Barnes & Noble or Amazon or whatever are 27:21 you gonna need that this new book is 27:23 coming out all you have to do it's 27:25 really funny if you google the title of 27:28 the book it will come up on your screen 27:30 sometimes the libraries near you who

have the book and if internet that you 27:36 know without even looking at your 27:38 library that you know so I think that 27:40 it's going to you know things I think 27:43 might change permanently in our country 27:46 right I mean it's it's going to be the 27:48 biggest hindrance on those who are still 27:50 are comfortable using and unfortunately 27:55 with the nature of this thing and the 27:58 fact that we work in a building where 27:59 stuff is touched a lot by a lot of 28:02 people it comes down to help to health 28:05 and safety and at the end if it's not 28:06 safe for people to browse then we're 28:10 gonna have to offer limited services 28:12 until it is deemed safer it's gonna be 28:16 it's going to be a culture shock like 28:22

displays like in the library like say 28:26 it's October 28:28 you know Queens there so you maybe go 28:31 stories history stuff like that and you 28:33 have like a digital slideshow you know 28:36 kind of running so the patrons could see 28:39 it and they go so it's kind of funny 28:41 that you say that because I'm Pamela 28:43 email me or earlier this week and she's 28:46 she's been brainstorming ideas to do 28:48 summer 28:51 virtually I was talking to her about 28:54 possibly like making a couple videos or 28:59 something like basically what I'd like 29:01 to do is something stating look kind of 29:04 like the PowerPoint that I did for the 29:05 rotary yesterday yes like a slideshow or 29:08

something showing what our services 29:11 would be once we started reopening and 29:13 then there's going to be signage outside 29:14 the building you know if you know when 29:17 we start doing curbside if we could put 29:20 like a QR code on the sign itself so 29:23 that when patrons come they can scan it 29:25 and then the video pops up so I mean you 29:28 know we could do that with staff staff 29:33 suggestions new items coming out you 29:36 know that that's that sort of thing so 29:37 I'm willing to beta-test that see what 29:39 their responses and then I mean I've 29:42 learned how to how to make videos you 29:44 know panels learn how to do a whole 29:45 bunch of I mean I'm definitely coming 29:49 out out of out of my comfort zone with 29:51

all this with stuff that I'm learning 29:53 how to do so so yeah there's all kinds 29:55 of possibilities for that you know just 29:58 another thought to why we're thinking 29:59 about it you know adults certainly could 30:02 browse online and pick out books but 30:04 when you bring your kids to the library 30:06 you take them and they get to pick out 30:08 stuff based on color and airplane and 30:11 all that kind of stuff right so it may 30:13 be that they have to walk in and say you 30:17 know could you pick out six books for my 30:19 you know three-year-old or could you 30:21 pick out airplane books or something 30:23 because can you imagine trying to pick 30:26 out which specific books you want in 30:28 picture books for your kids online I

don't know I know and it's hard because 30:33 we do have a lot of homeschooling 30:36 families that come out come in and every 30:38 member of their family has a card and 30:40 the limit of 50 so they're taking 30:42 hundreds of books 30:43 I mean we're gonna mean before all this 30:47 happened our numbers were going up we 30:49 were doing really good so now we gotta 30:51 figure out ways to try to get a modicum 30:54 of that back so so unfortunately guys we 30:58 gotta do this in stages so excuse me 31:01 have you gone into the book drop yet 31:03 no because it's there's nothing to do 31:06 with it because I've had it close 17 31:09 yeah well that's what I wanted so would 31:14 you tell me when it would be an

appropriate time for me to comment on 31:17 that 31:20 okay I heard from Mary Jean that some 31:27 libraries already have open book drops 31:30 and is right and I'm not suggesting that 31:34 we do it but then she said that the date 31:37 for the ability to relax period or 31:43 whatever you want to call it no I thank 31:48 you do the due dates could be coming up 31:52 quickly okay correct the current due 31:55 date for everything checks out right now 31:57 is June 1st you know and I know next 32:04 week it's gonna be tomorrow is yeah you 32:09 know we're gonna hear more next week so 32:11 if it's deemed necessary to to extend 32.14 them the system does anybody ends up 32:25 with overdue materials because of this 32:28

when we were open and we start you know 32:31 interacting again I'm willing to work 32:33 with anybody well you're gonna probably 32:39 have to clear that with the system my 32:41 concern is that I I don't mind the book 32:44 drop being closed I take it that if we 32:48 wanted to we could drop books off at 32:51 libraries that do have open book drops 32:54 and then that they eventually would get 32:55 back to Grand Isle is that correct okay 32:59 Joe rush gonna be coming to help you 33:05 books because you're still going to be 33:06 at minimum you know minimum staff right 33:08 why phase one that's that's 33:13 another reason to reopen it and when we 33:16 get allowed to go go into 33:17 one because there won't be anybody 33:18

coming into the building and the staff 33:20 that's there they can focus on taking 33:23 care of those materials right and 33:26 hopefully phase one will start before 33:29 the due date hits so that you'll have 33:33 hopefully a week to two weeks before 33:36 that due date come so that you guys 33:38 aren't gonna get they'll used with book 33:41 returns and Mary Jean and and this the 33:44 Library System's administration's 33:46 they've been really good about that so 33:48 I'm confident that they'll extend it you 33:50 know if necessary in that situation all 33:56 right but I you know just I know you 33:58 will but it's just important that we 34:00 monitor that see so that you folks don't 34:02 get hit with a big you know deluge or 34:06

all at once because of a due date thanks 34:09 okay 34:14 any other questions on the stage to part 34:16 of this draft and moving down to stage 34:23 three that would be its 75% capacity and 34:26 actually that that's where twelve twelve 34:28 staff members at a time would be allowed 34:31 for our for our library stage three and 34:34 more opening to the public so this 34:42 section here gives me pause basically 34:47 reinstating me to room use reinstate 34:49 programs programming reinstate gathering 34:51 and reinstate outreach this is very up 34:56 up in the air and it is going to depend 34:58 on what is allowed at that time just 35:00 like everything else in this in this 35:02 document 35:03

I mean stage three mmmm this might not 35:06 even be doable 35:07 Stage three I don't I don't know yet and 35:12 it also says reinstate outreach well 35:14 obviously that has to mean that the 35:16 major outreach that Pamela and I do on 35:18 Grand Island is kiddos corner I the 35:22 golden age center I st. and st. Tim's if 35:26 they're not open I can't I can't do 35:30 anything 35:31 so this this is going to be a huge 35:32 coordinated effort amongst all the 35:34 library and all the community partners 35:36 as well well could you even do those 35:41 kind of things with only 75 percent 35:43 staff well I was looking at like my 35:47 staffing levels before all this stuff 35:48

happens I mean the most that we'd have 35:51 in a building at a time staff wise would 35:54 be like eight people and that would be 35:55 because there was usually an hour lapse 35:58 between the one shift and the other and 36:01 that actually worked out really well 36:02 because then if there was anything going 36:04 on in the building that day the morning 36:06 shift could tell the afternoon evening 36:08 shift hey this is what's up this this 36:10 this is what you got going tonight so so 36:13 yeah I mean III think that that would be 36:16 doable because it's just me and Pamela 36:18 doing doing outreach and we never did 36:20 our outreach at the same time so 36:22 basically it's gonna be between her and 36:24 I when I'm not there then she would be

in charge and that's how we were running 36:27 it anyway so I think we're we're in a 36:32 better situation staff wise than some 36:36 other branches especially the small ones 36:39 out and out in the South towns because 36:41 there's some situations where 25% of 36:44 their staff is one person yeah it's kind 36:49 of scary so the last part of this after 36:54 going through all these different stages 36:56 and learning how the building is going 36:58 to run under current guidelines would be 37:00 ideally stage four back to 100% staffing 37:04 having the building open unrestricted 37:08 library services I still think this is 37:11 going to look different than how it was 37:12 before 37:14 Bridgette this there's also a point if 37:18

I'm correct even though this is a plan 37:23 that Mary Jean is sharing I think each 37:27 board is required to come up with a plan 37:29 that needs to be approved but they're 37:31 not sure who has to approve it correct 37:33 so this is just a general outline was 37:37 reiterate again in draft form it's going 37:39 to change for the directors in the 37:43 system to start 37:44 creating a plan for their individual 37:46 buildings not everything this plan is 37:48 gonna fit every single building because 37:50 each as we know there's 37 buildings 37:52 they're all different so basically my 37:56 job is to figure out a way to do each 38:00 individual phase the safest way possible 38:03 so that staff is safe and community safe

so I have a separate document that's 38:10 about four pages long which is just me 38:12 brainstorming for each phase so we're 38:16 supposed to be some more meetings next 38:18 week and then we're gonna nitty-gritty 38:20 this down further so there's that plan 38:23 have to be approved by the board I would 38:26 like you guys involved in that yes okay 38:29 so so probably at the end of this 38:32 meeting if we want to set another 38:35 meeting because right now our currently 38:37 our schedule for the year doesn't give 38:39 us another meeting until mid-july so 38:42 yeah I definitely want to talk about 38:44 this more with you guys before mid-july 38:46 so so that's the end of this draft any 38:55 other questions this was the last part 38:58
