Recommendations

Good Friday Friday, 4/17/23

A recognized county holiday. However, recommend staying open in 2023 again due to GI Recreation Dept. Easter program tie-in. This collaboration has been going on very successfully since 2018.

Veterans Day Saturday, 11/11/23

The actual holiday, but not the county observed holiday. Recommend being open.

2023 Grand Island Memorial Library Service Hour Scenarios

In 2022, we lost one of our PT Librarian I's to retirement. That position covered days off and was an on call for unforeseen call-ins for supervisory staff. For 2023, the position is budgeted at 1 hr/week.

There is a second PT Lib I who covers Monday mornings and is an on call as well. This position is budgeted at 5 hr/week for 2023. It is anticipated that this position may be vacated due to retirement in the next few years. We need to be proactive to cover this scenario as it would leave us with no recourse to cover shift supervision in the event both full time librarians were out. Not preparing for this would force the library to have to close for the short-staffed shifts.

The goal was to get the vacated PT Lib I position up to 19 hr/week to get a useable third supervisory position to allow for easier use of vacation time for the full-timers, make easier coverage for sick days and call-ins, and enhance teen and adult programming here at the library. I have been told that the request will not be granted in the 2023 budget cycle and it probably won't be granted in 2024 either.

Due to staff burnout and the inability to effectively cover days off, the following scenarios are being considered. **There should always be a librarian in the building during open hours in a supervisory position.** It is what is fair to the support staff and is the service expected and deserved by the community we serve. The following scenarios work with this in mind.

#1:

Contact HR to see if there are any recently retired full-time librarians who are looking for a floating position at one of the contracts.

A position like this would offer maybe a shift every other week or a few times a month based on the 1 hr/week budgeted for 2023 and is inconsistent. After consulting with HR, they know of no one who is looking for this kind of work situation, but will keep an eye out.

#2:

Change Monday hours from 9:30-8 to 12-8.

Pros: eliminates the one shift that does not have full time librarian coverage (9:30-12 on Mondays).

Cons: Same problem. No supervisory back up if the full-time librarian gets sick on a Monday or takes a vacation that includes a Monday. Band aid for part of the problem, doesn't solve it.

Close Mondays, extend Tuesdays to 8:00 and the two full-time librarians and full-time clerk would work Tuesday to Saturday.

Pros: this would solve the coverage and short staff problem by allowing enough staff to be on all hours we are open in the event of a sick day or a scheduled day off/vacation and give more daily shift support.

The full-time librarians and clerk would have 2 built in days off back-to-back. One of the days would be during the week to give staff the choice to make any personal appointments they would normally have to schedule around work time. In the case of the full timers, they would normally need to use accrued time to make these appointments otherwise.

With more staff on, more projects can be completed and the staff could catch up on daily tasks easier.

This scenario would still allow for service hours 2 evenings a week and Saturdays.

Cons: The library would lose a service day. 51hr/week down to 43.5 (still meeting the State minimum standard for service hours).

The full-time librarians and clerk would be working Saturdays and would have to use accrued time to get a Saturday off.

Summers:

Close on Saturdays between Memorial Day and Labor Day, with Mondays open 9:30-5.

If Scenario #3 approved, the changes would take place starting January 2, 2023.
