Hamburg Library report, submitted by Librarian Ashley Cassidy

Donation Bins

Sleep in Heavenly Peace collected donations to provide children in the city of Buffalo with free beds. Requested donations included new twin-sized mattress pads, comforters, sheets, pillows and pillow cases. The donation bin was located by the desk. The bin filled twice!

The Hamburg Library was a drop off location of nonperishable food and personal care items for our neighbors affected by the May 14th tragedy at Tops Supermarket in Buffalo. This drive was coordinated through Home School Families of Erie County and FeedMore WNY.

Summer Reading

Summer reading officially began June 20. Reading logs for ages birth-4 and 5-11 can pick up reading logs at either branch. Teens and adults can join us online at ReadSquared. Prizes have been generously donated by the Friends of the Hamburg Public Library, Bella Pizza, Comfort Zone Café, Hamburg Palace Theatre, Main Street Ice Cream, and Penn Dixie Fossil Park & Nature Reserve. Library Associate Laurie Obrochta redesigned the circulation desk as a pirate ship and built a beachside display. The graphics department from the Central Library installed a giant octopus in the children's area. Senior pages Shannon Carnall and Jayne Gannon designed an interactive wall for book recommendations.







Class Visits

In May, schools were able to resume field trips, for the first time since 2020! We had 5 kindergarten classes from Union Pleasant Elementary visit on separate occasions in May (98 visitors). We also had the first grade class from Blasdell Elementary visit in May (72 visitors). In June, the Charlotte Avenue Elementary Kindergarten classes visited (53 visitors). This is the first time we have had class visits from Blasdell and Charlotte Avenue! Each visit included a craft, story and tour. All students went home with a library card application and a summer reading log.

Classroom Collections

In June we established a new partnership for classroom collections! We will provide three collections of 25 books each for a kindergarten summer school class at Union Pleasant Elementary. It is expected that this will continue for the regular school session in the fall. We now have three agencies (5 classrooms) for which we provide collections.

Summer Hours

Summer hours began on June 13. Hamburg will be closed on Sundays and Lake Shore hours remain the same.

Annual Compliance Training

Each year all employees are required to complete Kantola Training on Harassment Prevention and Workplace Violence. All staff who worked in June completed the training.

New Library Cards

In May the Hamburg Library issued 56 library cards to adults and 27 children. In June our new users were 1 agency, 55 adults and 36 children.

Programs at the Hamburg Library:

Start-ups and Bankruptcy

Senator Sean M. Ryan and Assemblymember Jon D. Rivera sponsored a program at the Hamburg Library on May 7 to discuss small business or personal bankruptcy questions.

Wizard of Oz at the Hamburg Palace Theatre

Assemblymember Jon D. Rivera hosted a community event at the Hamburg Palace Theatre, with the library, Buffalo Zoo and Buffalo Museum of Science. Librarian Ashley Cassidy met Assistant Deputy Director Samantha Purpora with the new Library2Go van at the event. We distributed summer reading information and program calendars for both Hamburg and Lake Shore libraries, and offered a craft. We had 96 people stop by our booth.

Local Authors Jennifer Hillman and Bill McKeever

Local authors Jennifer Hillman and Bill McKeever discussed "Secret Places of Western New York: 25 Scenic Hikes," co-authored with Bruce Kershner on May 9. The program drew 10 adults.

Storytime with Miss Laurie

Library Associate Laurie Obrochta resumed storytime in May. We offered two sessions with a limit of 30 total participants in each. Registration was available online, with a separate registration for each week. Most sessions were at or near capacity. On May 11, we had local author Carolyn Grassmick join us to share her book "Joey and the Jelly Beans."

Sunday Screenings

Our last Sunday movie of the season was Aquaman on May 15, with one attendee.

Phoebe the Reading Dog

Phoebe visited on May 14 and June 11. We welcomed Kruz, a certified therapy dog and friend of Phoebe, at the end of June while Phoebe recovered from a procedure. All three events drew 36 total attendees.

Red Cross Blood Drive

The Red Cross came to the library for a blood drive on May 23.

Libby Class

The Techknow Lab came to the library on June 6 to provide instruction on using the library service Libby. There were 4 attendees.

Storytime at Smarty Pants Childcare

Librarian Ashley Cassidy continues to visit Smarty Pants Childcare once a month to provide storytimes for the Preschool and Kinder-Ready classes.

Cookbook Club

Librarian Leslie Carr hosts a dinner once a month at the library, with a cookbook from the collection as inspiration. In May we had 14 attendees, and June there were 10. The participants have a great time socializing, and stay until close!

LEGO Club

LEGO club meets once a month. Registration is limited to 20 participants for each session.

Scavenger Hunts

In May we offered a Star Wars Scavenger Hunt in the children's area, which had 323 participants. In June we offered a Fish Scavenger Hunt, which had 354 participants.

Take and Makes

We continue to prepare and distribute 100 crafts kits for children each week, and 40-50 craft kits for teens each month.

- We put out supplies for kids to use their imaginations to craft a specific project. Weather Report had 20 participants and Decorate a Door Hanger had 40 participants.
- The Red Cross held a Blood Drive in the meeting room on Wednesday, May 25 and collected 12 units.
- On Tuesday, June 7 we held a Book a Technology Trainer event through the TechKnow Lab with three attendees.
- Through the Erie County Office of Consumer Protection, we held an Identity Theft and Credit program with one attendee.
- On Wednesday, we held a Live Animal Demonstration with reptiles, amphibians, and insects with the help of Earth Spirit Educational. We had 40 attendees.
- Summer Reading began on Tuesday, June 21 with programs for four age groups: Birth-4, Ages 5-11, Teens, and Adults.
- Librarian Stephanie Molnar engaged in 9.75 hours of continuing education in May and June.
- The meeting room was used ten times by outside organizations.
