In March, the librarians from West Seneca schools visited the Hamburg Library for a professional development day. Ashley provided a tour and discussed current concerns in the library field.

Baby Bounce

In March Library Associate Laurie Obrochta began a new program, for ages birth-24 months. It runs on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month and has been very popular. Each session has 20-25 babies plus their caregivers in attendance.

Family Story Time w/Miss Laurie

Laurie continues to lead a family storytime on Wednesday mornings in the Children's Area. More than 200 children and parents attend each session.

Tales at Twilight

Librarian Ashley continues to host an evening storytime for ages 3 and up on Mondays. She has a regular group of 15-20 children each week.

Bookworms

Librarian Ashley continues to hold a monthly book club for middle grade readers. In March the group read *Magic Misfits* and had special guest magician Sean Doolan. He demonstrated several magic tricks and told everyone a bit about the magic community. In April they read *Spy School* and attempted to break out of an escape room.

Book a Technology Trainer

The Techknow Lab visited in March to provide 6 one-on-one sessions covering technology topics.

Wednesday Wellness Series

In March, April and May, a wellness series covering topics such as Managing Emotional Wellness, Eating for Older Adults, and Secrets to a Good Night's Sleep was offered. Cookbook Club

The monthly Cookbook Club has been going extremely well, with more people attending every month.
