BUILDING & GROUNDS UPDATES

- 8/7, Our HVAC monitoring desktop computer in REI Caretaker's work area experienced a hard drive failure.
 - The computer's failure does not affect the overall performance of the HVAC system as the computer's primary role is providing the REI Caretaker a way of *monitoring* the HVAC performance.
 - The HVAC system provides service technicians with other means of monitoring and controlling its performance.
 - We are pursuing a replacement computer in conjunction with the B&ECPL Information Technology Department and Johnson Controls.
 - We would like to have the replacement ready before the seasonal change from cooling to heating.
- 8/15, Dawn Stanton from the B&ECPL Development & Communications Department met with REI Branch Manager Matthew Best at REI.
 - Dawn assessed the library's signage and took and order for sign replacements and additions.
 - The new signs will replace damaged and outdated signs.
 - Will feature new colors and provide improved identification of library collections and service locations within the library.
 - All signs will be produced by the B&ECPL Development & Communications Department's Graphics
 Team
- 8/24, A power outage within the library and local neighborhood caused Branch Manager Matthew Best to close the library at 4 pm.
 - Patrons were ushered out of the building for their safety.
 - It was an overcast day, so some areas within the library were in dark shadows after the power outage.
 The restrooms were unlit.
 - Library staff remained on sight, working in areas with natural lighting until scheduled 6 pm closing time.
 - The power was restored to building and the local neighborhood sometime after 6 pm.
- 8/31, A Johnson Controls technician was requested to determine the cause of a glycol leak from the HVAC system.
 - The slow dripping leak created a small puddle of glycol beside the HVAC system on the mechanical room floor.
 - The technician determined the leak was coming from a damaged control valve. The leak is slow and intermittent, but the control valve will need to be replaced.
 - The technician sent a repair quote to John Ciesielski Town of Cheektowaga Facilities Department General Crew Chief
 - The replacement parts will be ordered pending John's approval. A repair date is TBA.
 - o In the meantime, the HVAC system performance will not be affected dramatically.
