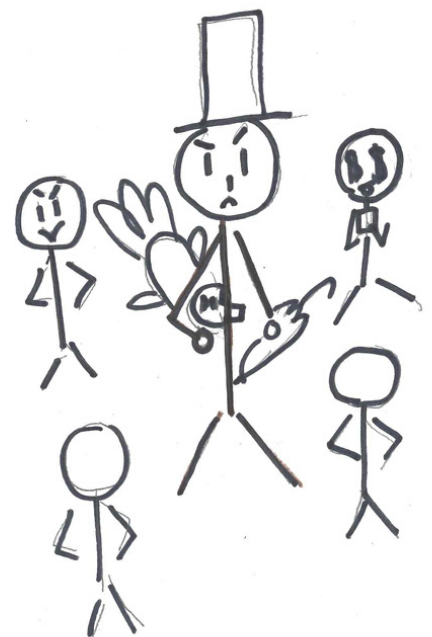
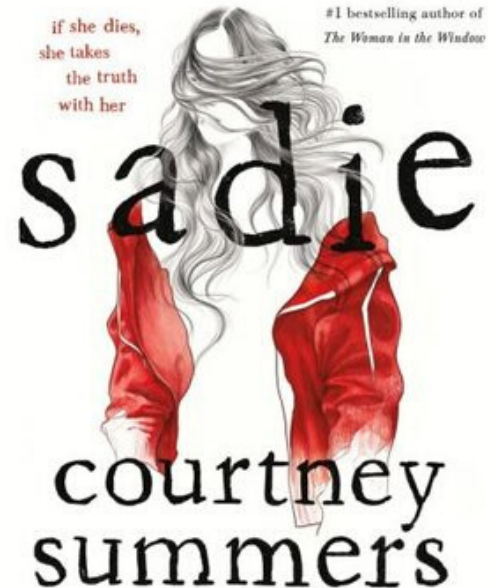

A: idk. 2/10? I really just wanna write a death note review leave me alone

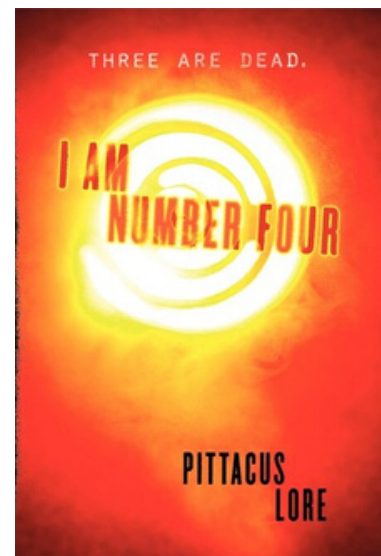
N: 0/10. I bet no one even reads it.
