	In this landmark work of history, the National Book Award—winning author of <i>American Sphinx</i> explores how a group of greatly gifted but deeply flawed individuals—Hamilton, Burr, Jefferson, Franklin, Washington, Adams, and Madison—confronted the overwhelming challenges before them to set the course for our nation.
Feb. 24 th at 6:30 pm	Classic – Pudd'nhead Wilson by Mark Twain
	The central intrigue revolves around two boys—one, born into slavery, with black ancestry; the other, white, born to be the master of the house. The two boys, who look similar, are switched at infancy. Each grows into the other's social role.
Mar. 30 th at 6:30 pm	Irish Author – A Week in Winter by Maeve Binchy
	Chicky opens up a holiday hotel as a safe haven for guests and natives. The heartwarming story introduces all the beloved characters and townsfolk who help to make Chicky's dreams turn into a reality.
Apr. 27 th at 6:30 pm	Humorous Fiction – Good Omens by Neil Gaiman and Terry Pratchett
	The world is going to end next Saturday, but there are a few problems--the Antichrist has been misplaced, the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse ride motorcycles, and the representatives from heaven and hell decide that they like the human race.
May 25 th at 6:30 pm	Mystery – The Family Upstairs by Lisa Jewell
	Twenty-five years ago, police were called to 16 Cheyne Walk with reports of a baby crying. When they arrived, they found a healthy ten-month-old happily cooing in her crib in the bedroom. Downstairs in the kitchen lay three dead bodies, all dressed in black, next to a hastily scrawled note. And the four other children reported to live at Cheyne Walk were gone.
