
Duct Tape Tassel

Supplies:

Duct tape, scissors, ruler



Step 1:

To make a tassel with regular duct tape, you'll need to measure out a 10-inch strip of duct tape.




Step 2:

Take a second 10 inch strip of duct tape and lay it over the first, sticky-side to sticky-side. Have a little bit overlapping at the top, as shown in the picture.



Step 3:

Fold over the overlapped to secure the two strips together. You will have an exposed sticky bit of tape on the opposite side.



Step 4: Trim the edges of your strips.



Step 5:

Very carefully (and with an adult's supervision for the little ones) make lots of little cuts in the long side of your tape that does not have the sticky side exposed. Don't cut all the way to the top! Leave at least a thumb's width so that your fringe is secured to the rest of the strip.



Step 6: Keep making little snips until your entire strip is fringed.



Step 7: Roll your fringed strip so that you're rolling the sticky exposed tape onto itself. This will help hold your tassel together.



Step 8: When you're done rolling, give the top of your tassel a good pinch to make sure the sticky tape is holding it together.



Step 9:
You can wrap more tape around the top to secure it, as well as use a strip of folded-over tape to create a loop so that you can hang it!



Your tassels can go anywhere! You can put them on strings for jewelry, tie them onto your shoelaces... anything you want to embellish!

Duct Tape Lanyard



Step 1: Cut a piece of Duct Tape about 3 feet long. Lay it out flat on a table.

Step 2: Folded one side of the duct tape towards the middle, all the way down.

- Work in small sections and go slow so you don't wrinkle up the tape
- Start in the middle, and work your way to the middle.
- Repeat with the second side, making sure both sides meet without any sticky surface remaining

Step 3: Make a loop (or put it around your neck) and pull the two ends through your metal ring. Make sure you are taping to the back of the lanyard (where the tape comes together)

Alternate finish: Make a loop and tape, add the metal ring, and tape the two ends together resulting in one long loop (that doesn't fan out at the bottom).



Step 4: Fold the pieces over the circle and tape them to the straps. (2 in x 1in strip of tape) Flipped it over and put another 2 in x 1in strip of tape across.










What You Need:


- Scissors
- Duct Tape
- Paper or junk mail envelopes

Instructions:

1. Cut a two triangles from your paper (or one corner off of an envelope). Then cut two pieces of Duct Tape. They need to be long enough to cover the triangle.




2. Lay one piece of Duct Tape sticky side up on your work surface. Place the open side of the triangle on the edge of the tape.



3. Put the second piece of Duct Tape on the other side of the triangle.



4. Cut off the excess tape.



5. Enjoy!
