We have been developing a drop-off/pick-up schedule with many of our usual facilities so we can still get our patrons the books and movies they want. Once a month, we have been gathering requests that have been called in or emailed and dropping them off at the facility. We also have been picking up returns so that patrons do not accrue late fees. We are also able to bring other resources as well, such as online articles, coloring pages and more.

We have been rolling our bookcarts out onto the sidewalk and setting up outside so patrons can browse comfortably and safely.
