2022 - A Year in Review

We are winding down on another year with the Mobile Services department and as always, we like to look back and see what we have accomplished. This year has been an incredibly productive one! The *Library2GO* van joined our department in February and increased our lobby stops from 10 monthly stops in 2021 to 25 monthly stops by the end of this year. This allowed more time for school and community stops with the Library on Wheels Bookmobile. We are currently serving 19 schools and visiting nine community locations monthly. With the increase, we saw over 16,000 library visitors, with 10,000 attending mobile programs and over 1,000 new library card sign ups in 2022. These numbers doubled from last vear, and it is all thanks to our community's continued interest in our library!

We also saw an increase in services and programs provided by the mobile libraries. Terrariums, wildflower pots, and treasure maps were just some of the crafts available on the Bookmobile throughout the year. The *Library2GO* van offered puzzles, e-readers and CD players to those who requested them. The new and exciting *Road2Reading* program was launched this fall to promote early literacy to preschools and davcares throughout Erie County.

Thank you for your ongoing support and passion for your libraries! Our staff have lots of new ideas ready for the upcoming year and we are grateful for you! We look forward to another year of mobile services. Until then, have a wonderful holiday season and a great New Year!






Nonfiction Highlight



The High Notes by Danielle Steel



Winter holidays are a time for families and friends to get together. But that also means a greater risk for fire. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

HOLIDAY DECORATING

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors.



HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING

- Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- Ask smokers to smoke outside. Remind smokers to keep their smoking materials with them so young children do not touch them.
- Provide large, deep ashtrays for smokers. Wet cigarette butts with water before discarding.



Before Heading Out or to Bed Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Turn off all light string

bed. **Turn off** all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

More than one-third of home decoration fires are started by candles.

More than two of every five decoration fires happen because decorations are placed too close to a heat source.
