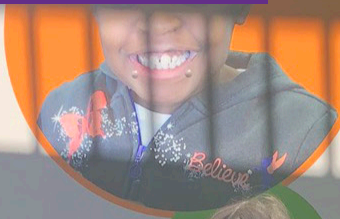

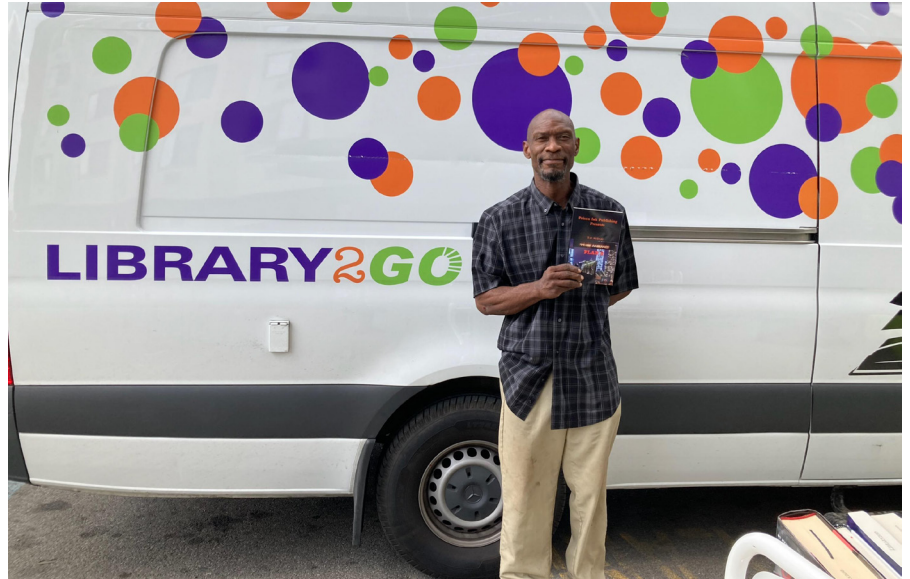


News Roundup:

- Audubon Library is closed through 1/31/23 due to construction.
- Crane Branch Library is closed for construction. Reopening is expected in early summer 2023.
- Isaias Gonzalez-Soto Branch Library is closed for construction until mid-winter.
- The Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, Buffalo History Museum, and East Side community worked together to preserve momentos left for the victims of the May 14th Jefferson Avenue tragedy. These items will be archived at the Buffalo History Museum.
- Library director John Spears spoke in Albany at a hearing concerning the proposed state budget, advocating for more funds to be directed toward libraries.
- On December 16, 2022, officials from Project Flight, Inc., the Buffalo & Erie County Public Libraries, as well as students from St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute, Congressman Brian Higgins, Deputy Erie County Executive Lisa Chimera, Erie County Legislator Howard Johnson and representatives from the Butler Library unveiled the new Literacy Library Collection for Equity, Social Justice & Peace at the Merriweather Branch Library on the East Side of Buffalo. Design

Architect Robert Traynham Coles' striking circular design, with its interconnected interior spaces, is intended to suggest an African Village. The library features an African American Resource Room, adult and youth reading rooms, a technology training lab, auditorium, parking lot and an African motif in the block facade. The building replaced the nearly 80-year-old North Jefferson Branch Library and is named after Frank E. Merriweather, Jr., editor and publisher of The Criterion newspaper, the oldest running minority newspaper in upstate New York.

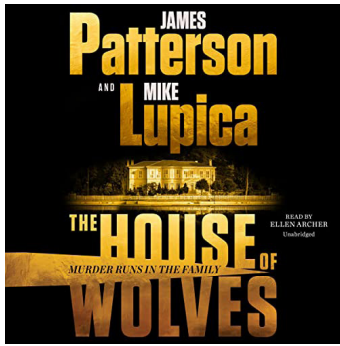

Mahogany Doors

Adinkra are visual symbols, originally created by the Akan of Ghana and the Gyaman of Cote d'Ivoire in West Africa that represent concepts or original thoughts. Adinkra are used on fabric, walls, in pottery, woodcarvings and logos and can also be used to communicate evocative messages that represent parts of their life or those around them. The Adinkra symbols are not just decorative objects or drawings, but actual messages conveying ancient traditional wisdom relevant to aspects of life or the environment.

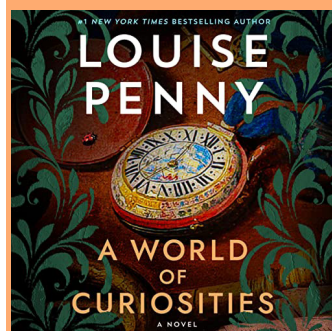
