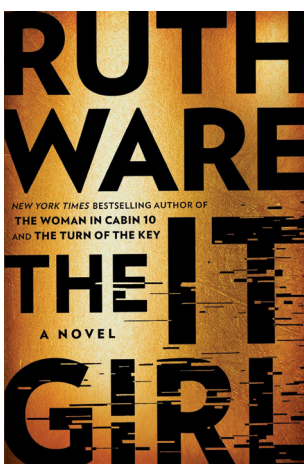
The Best Is Yet to Come by Debbie Macomber
