
Bookin' It



Kindle eReaders available for check out

The B&ECPL Mobiles Department is excited to begin our pilot program for eReader checkouts! Have you ever been interested in trying out a Kindle eReader or looking for more titles in large print? Ask about testing a Kindle with your next checkout. A Kindle is a device for reading digital books. If print books are too heavy to lift or the text is too small, a Kindle is a great alternative. The device is lightweight and can hold multiple electronic books on it with no added weight. Text sizes can be changed so that every book you read is large print.

If you are interested in checking out a Kindle device, please speak with one of our staff members. The loan period is for the same time as other library material (4 weeks for Bookmobile, 6 weeks for Library by Mail) and will come with the requested books already loaded on it. All you have to do is tap the book you want to read and enjoy reading it! Staff are also available to help with any questions or concerns about the devices.

On another note, thank you to everyone that returned the newsletter survey! They were filled with great ideas and we look forward to implementing them starting with this newsletter.






A warm and funny book by Pulitzer Prize winning author Rick Bragg about the stray half-blind dog who transforms his life. A must read for all animal lovers!








The Beginning by Beverly Lewis




Lovecraft Country by Matt Ruff


Twisted: The Tangled History of Black Hair Culture by Emma Dabiri

Told through a series of essays both personal and historical, Dabiri explores the history, sociology, and racism surrounding Black hair that is still poignant today.




The Nickel Boys by Colson Whitehead

Learn about the creation of the Green Book, a travel guide that assisted African Americans with safe travels from 1936 to 1966.








Hitting a Straight Lick with a Crooked Stick by Zora Neale Hurston

Children's stories through the centuries

Central Library Exhibit • Open now through 2023



In 1896 the Buffalo Public Library opened its first Children's Room, one of the few libraries in the U.S. to have one. And as one of the first, it's fitting that the Rare Book room has amassed a significant children's book collection, spanning nearly 400 years.

Mechanical, or Movable Books - Pop Up Books

- Mechanical books evolved from printed 14th- and 15th-century scientific and mathematical texts
- The simple turn of a page transforms a two-dimensional page into a three-dimensional sculpture
- Astronomers, mathematicians and anatomists created moveable diagrams, mostly revolving disks or paper wheels with rotating parts, known as "volvelles"



The 'Pop-Up' Pinocchio by Carlo Collodi, illustrated by Harold Lentz (1932) – from which we based our life-sized Pinocchio.

Favorite Stories - books that help us grow and imagine

- Mid-1700's children begin to be seen as separate, distinct people, rather than miniature adults.
- John Newbery, who encouraged this idea, was known as the 'Father of Children's Literature,' and started a publishing house dedicated to children's stories. The Newbery Medal was established in 1922 for distinguished contributions to children's literature.

 Stories written for children help develop emotional intelligence and creativity, nurtures growth and development of personality and social skills as well as an understanding and appreciation for different people

and cultures.

- As writing for children became more popular, many different types of books were developed. Readers could choose from adventure stories like Robinson Crusoe, to the fantasy of The Jungle book or Peter Pan and Wendy, to the realism of Strawberry Girl
- Many of these now classic stories continue to be printed, as well as adapted for movie and TV.





Robinson Crusoe multiple editions – first published in 1719 and was so popular that the spin-offs or similar cast-away stories became known as "Robinsonade." Earliest edition, on display, is from 1720, and you can see here a variety of other printings/editions.

Library Services - Mobiles




Bookmobile
