CD players can be borrowed for the same time period as other Library materials through the Bookmobile (4 weeks) or Library by Mail (6 weeks) and can be renewed if there are no holds or repairs needed. This is a great way to try out some of the 11,000+ audiobooks in the Library's collection.

The CD players are small enough to fit in our standard mailing bags and are simple to use! They include a power cord and feature a built-in speaker for volume control. The buttons are large and easy to push, making

starting and stopping the CD easily accessible.

Audiobooks have many added benefits beyond the joy of listening to a good book. According to Psychology Today, audiobooks have the ability to reduce negative thinking by interrupting depressive or anxious thoughts. Audiobooks are also great for time management, allowing you to multitask: work on chores, activities, and commutes while listening to your favorite book. 

New Exhibit

Audubon's *Viviparous Quadrupeds of North America* A Great National Work



Naturalist and painter John James Audubon is best known for his *Birds of America*, the double size pages of beautiful ornithological images. Lesser known but equally ambitious, was his work *The Viviparous Quadrupeds of North America* featuring illustrations of four-legged mammals. Begun while working on *The Birds*, this project of 150 exquisite hand-colored lithographic plates took him ten years to complete, from 1839-1849. When the Quadrupeds were finished, Audubon was credited with another artistically stunning and scientifically significant contribution to our understanding of American natural history.
