To kick off a fine free future, every library cardholder will notice their account has been cleared of past overdue fines and hold fees.

Fine Free FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

Do I still have to pay charges that are on my account prior to libraries going fine free? If you have returned all materials, fines have been removed from your account. Charges for lost or damaged materials and other miscellaneous charges will remain.

What fines are being waived? Fines/fees for all patrons at all libraries with the following reasons:

- Daily late (overdue) charges
- Hold charges for requested materials
- Unclaimed hold charges for requested material not picked up
- Lost library card charges

Fairy Tales/Fables

- In Ancient times, the Fable was told or performed as an enjoyable moral lesson.
- The most notable of the storytellers is Aesop (c. 620 – 564 BCE) 6th century
- May have been of African descent and is believed to have written over 600 stories, though none of his writings survive
- Stories often depict animals with human characteristics to teach a lesson ("the Tortoise and the Hare," slow and steady wins the race – "the Ant and the



Grasshopper," hard work and planning for future)

• The Library's earliest is Fabulae Varorium Auctorum (1660), 17th century Greek and Latin edition

Fairy Tales

- Evolved from the early oral storytelling traditions and often featured a fantasy or magical land of fairies, giants and witches. There is usually a conflict of good vs. evil and they always have a happy ending.
- Father of the modern fairy tale, Frenchman Charles Perrault (1628-1703), was the most popular of his time. Considered the creator of Mother Goose, the imaginary storyteller. Best known works include "Cinderella," "Puss in Boots" and "Little Red Riding Hood"
- Perhaps the most recognizable compilers of the fairy tale are the **Brothers** Jacob (1785-1863) and Wilhelm (1786-1859) **Grimm**. Published 17 large and small editions of their most famous work Nursery and Household Tales (1812-1864). Some tales that are still popular today and distinctly Grimm include, "Hansel and Gretel," "Rapunzel" and "Snow White."
- Danish author **Hans Christian Andersen** (1805-18750, Recognized for the quality of his storytelling he raised the fairy tale to an innovative literary form, many of which have been retold on stage and screen. Among his creations are "The Emperor's New Clothes," "The Little Mermaid," and "The Ugly Duckling".

Why do I still have a balance on my account?

While the Library is waiving most charges, those for lost or damaged materials and other miscellaneous charges will remain.

How will the Library get people to return borrowed materials?

"No fines" does not mean "no responsibility." Materials will still have due dates and patrons are expected to return materials on time. Other

libraries who have removed overdue fines have reported no significant impact on material return rates. Additionally, materials that are 21 days (change from 35 days) overdue are assumed lost and patrons will be charged for replacement and processing costs.
