Banned Books Week is September 26 - October 2 this year and celebrates our freedom to read. During this week, libraries, schools, and the book industry focus on current and historical attempts to censor books in schools and libraries. This celebrational week began in the 1980s after the 1982 Supreme Court case Island Trees School District v. Pico ruled that school officials could not remove material from school libraries based on content.

Since then, books have continued to be challenged for many different reasons. However, due to the tireless efforts of educators, librarians, and community members, most of these titles remain uncensored and available for reading. Every year, the American Library Association posts the "Top 10 Most Challenged" books of the year, which we have included in this newsletter. You can request the books to read for yourself! Many are available in large print and/or audiobook.



Top 10 Most Challenged Books of 2020



A challenge is an attempt to remove or restrict materials or services based on content. Overall, 273 books were targeted. 
Challenged, banned, and restricted for LGBTQIA+ content, conflicting with a religious viewpoint, and not reflecting "the values of our community"

Banned and challenged because of author's public statements, and because of claims that the book contains "selective storytelling incidents" and does not encompass racism against all people




All American Boys by Jason Reynolds and Brendan Kiely

Banned and challenged for profanity, drug use, and alcoholism, and because it was thought to promote anti-police views, contain divisive topics, and be "too much of a sensitive matter right now"



Speak by Laurie Halse Anderson

Banned, challenged, and restricted because it was thought to contain a political viewpoint and it was claimed to be biased against male students, and for the novel's inclusion of rape and profanity


Banned and challenged for profanity, sexual references, and allegations of sexual misconduct by the

Banned and challenged for racial slurs and racist stereotypes, and their negative effect on students

Banned and challenged because it was considered sexually explicit and depicts child sexual abuse




The Hate U Give by Angie Thomas
