





How can educators get students a library card?

- Library card applications can be printed online or obtained at any library
- E-library card for all ages! http://vf.buffalolib.org/vufind/OnlineSignup/Home/

Adult applicants, 17 and up, will receive a full privilege card.

Youth applicants, 16 and younger, are able to apply for one of two card types:

- If a parent/guardian fills in the consent area of the form, the applicant will receive a full privilege youth card. Parents will have an opportunity to change the profile to restrict video or Internet permissions upon receipt of the physical card.
- If the parent/guardian section is not completed, the applicant will receive a Student Digital Card. A Student Digital Card is enabled for online services only, including OverDrive, Freegal, and homework help via the research databases, etc. These cards cannot be used to check out library materials, nor do they allow the cardholder to access the Internet on a library computer. The card can be upgraded by visiting any library location with the parent/guardian.

Each Graphic Novel Classroom Kit contains 30 copies of the selected book, subject specific audio/visual material, a folder of support materials and an information/contents sheet.

















Award Winners - Caldecott

It is awarded annually by the Association for Library Service to Children, a division of the American Library Association, to the artist of the most distinguished American picture book for children.


Award Winners - Newbery

• The Coretta Scott King Book Awards are given annually to outstanding African American authors and illustrators of books for children and young adults that demonstrate an appreciation of African American culture and universal human values. The award commemorates the life and work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and honors his wife, Mrs. Coretta Scott King, for her courage and determination to continue the work for peace and world brotherhood.

(Theodor Seuss) Geisel Award


