### A Busy Year in Tonawanda

As with most years, 2011 brought change to the City of Tonawanda Library. Bev Federspiel, who had been Director at Tonawanda for 3 years, is now Director of the Lockport Library. This opening allowed us to welcome a new Director to our library, Mr. Glenn Luba. Glenn has worked in the Erie County system as branch manager at the Riverside Library, and many departments at the Central Library. He also brings a fresh eye and lots of enthusiastic ideas with him, and we are thrilled that he is part of our team!

The Buffalo and Erie County Public Library system celebrated its



175th Anniversary this year, and we are growing too. There is a definite increase in the use of eBooks and downloadable audio books, and our inlibrary computer usage is up 13% over 2010. We held 25% more programs this year, and the number of registered resident borrowers increased by nearly 5%.



### For Adults

Library programs aren't just for kids anymore! Many patrons took advantage of our free computer training and attended various classes including Word, Excel and Publisher Basics; Google It!, Introduction to Facebook.

Skype and YouTube. The Training Lab staff keeps on developing relevant classes, and then they bring the lab right to us!

The Swiftwater Reading Club met seven times to discuss both new and classic books. This book club truly

has a loyal following, often close to twenty people participate.

The crafty in town also had a presence at the library, with our Friday morning Knitting Club. They brought much camaraderie and laughter, as well as support for fellow yarn enthusiasts.

### Patron Updates

After months of encoding the library materials for RFID and self checkout, Tonawanda's piece of this project went live at the end of November. Security gates were installed at the entrances, and patrons are now able to check out their own materials, with the option of printing or emailing their receipt. DVDs no longer need to be retrieved from the staff office. They are right out on the open shelf for easy browsing and quick checkout. Change is never easy, but as the pub-

increasingly popular, and the price is right when it comes to free library downloading! Our Computer Training Lab staff has begun posting Training Guides and Online Screencasts to the library website. These resources walk patrons through the steps involved in the downloading process.

Shelf labeling and weeding are ongoing projects that keep the library fresh and patron-ready.

### **Building Improvements**

Our library is looking better these days, thanks to some improvements to the building and the surrounding grounds. A rock garden was installed at the parking lot entrance, complete with beautiful perennials and a bird feeder. Design and labor were provided by our very own Glenn

Luba! Also on the parking lot side, a shade garden has been started thanks to Ed McKee (former Director Mary McKee's husband). The Flag Pole has also been given a fresh coat of paint and a surrounding garden.
