Observing Pollinators- approx. \$120-145

Pollinators are animals that assist plants in their reproductive cycles and are critical to the world's food supply. In recent years their populations have suffered severe declines, especially among honey bee colonies. The Great Sunflower Project engages volunteers to help scientists understand and respond to changes in pollinator populations and the types of flowering plants that pollinators prefer from wherever they are. Participants simply observe any flowering plant for less than 15 minutes, count and identify the pollinators that visit the plant, then log data online as instructed.
